

WHITE-WINGED DOVE OF PEACE

Senator Kearns Orders Anti-Mormon Fight to Cease--Coal Rate to Boise Reduced for the Present

(Boise, Idaho, Capital News.)

The large white dove of peace bearing in its beak an 8x10 olive branch is hovering over Utah. The Hons are going down with the lambs with an illuminated motto over their stalls bearing the legend, "God bless our motto: boost, don't knock." After being clubbed over the head with epithets, knocked sideways with bricks in the form of resolutions, surrounded with fake stories sent broadcast throughout the country and generally demoralized the Mormons will be permitted to breathe, move and have their being once more. The fact that there is a general election next fall of course has nothing to do with this sweet halcyon rest. Some people are unkind enough to say that because the attempt to organize an anti-Mormon party flattened out dolefully on Monday night the malcontents have concluded to come in out of the rain and get at the pie counter next fall.

This sudden change of heart followed the receipt of a mysterious telegram from the East last week. The dispatch is alleged to have borne the signature of "Our Tom." Immediately following came the news that the manager of a rabid afternoon paper here had resigned on account of ill health. The next day this paper came out with the statement that everybody was going to get a fair show and the way stories had been sent out regarding the Mormons was scandalous. Then a number of prominent Mormons got themselves inter-

viewed and incidentally deplored the fact that any attempt was being made to drink about the old conditions in Utah. The rest scrambled into line and arranged themselves into a grand tableau as the curtain was rung down on the revolt of the disgruntled pie hunters. Then came another thunderclap. The city council which has resembled a rough house ever since the new administration went in on the first of the year, took upon itself the aspect of a hard shell Baptist prayer meeting as the opposing forces did the "after you dear Oaston" stunt. The city employees have all received their pay after having to live on credit for nearly two months and the protocol has been signed. It is now predicted, without any mental reservation, that peace and good fellowship will prevail in Utah until after election.

JEFFERSON SCHOOL TANGLE

School district No. 17 is in a peculiar predicament, and the taxpayers are endeavoring to straighten out the tangle. A 6-mill tax was levied on the property in the district for school purposes, the total levy amounting to \$153. Upon careful investigation, it has been discovered that a portion of the property has been left out of the assessment, the error occurring where farms are located in two districts. The total tax collected to date is only \$75, and the district will be handicapped in the school work, providing the original amount levied is not collected. Mr. A. C. Libby, of Jefferson, one of the patrons of the school, is in the city in consultation with Assessor Lembecke and Sheriff Colbath concerning the matter.

Lost in the Mountains.

Last week Gabriel Plymale went out with two companions named James and Johnson, on a prospecting tour in the vicinity of the Sterling mine. On Tuesday he was left at the cabin, to take care of the camp, while the other two men were out prospecting. On their return in the evening Plymale was not to be found. Not a great deal of attention was at first paid to this circumstance, as it was thought he had gone to some of the neighboring cabins. The next morning, however, becoming uneasy, James and Johnson commenced a search for him. Snow had fallen the night before, obliterating all traces, so that it was impossible to track him. The search was kept up Saturday and that night word was sent to Medford. Several people went out Sunday to join in the search.

H. W. Jackson, H. G. Nicholson and T. E. Kelso left Wednesday morning

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to help in the search. Jackson took his famous bloodhounds and expects to be able to find the body, if death has overtaken the lost man.

They returned Wednesday night, not having been able to find any trace of the missing man. The searchers are considerably handicapped by the snow that has fallen during the past few days. The dogs will be taken out again Saturday, by which time it is expected the snow will have melted so that the search can be made successfully.—Medford Mail.
