NEW YORK POLITICAL LETTER

Conflicts Between the Parkerites and the Antis

Difficulties of Silencing the Demands of the Tiger

New York, April 2.—The friends of Judge Parker who may have been diligently working for his candidacy do not find it such easy sailing as they had expected in the beginning. Now, that the Parker boom has been fairly launched, opposition is arising in unexpected quarters, and if the judgment of certain well-informed politicians can be accepted there is not much hope that Parker will receive the support of the united Democracy of New York.

The recent trouble between Murphy, the Tammany leader, and Cleveland champion and McCarren, who had been indiscreet enough to join the Hill forces, supporting Parker, has cleared the mist that had been hanging over the political situation and has led to a grouping of the contending elements. The Bryanites among the New York Democrats are bitterly opposed to Parker and are on record as outspoken on the silver question and do not believe that he would get a strong vote. They point to the fact that Judge Parker, on the occasion of the only time when he was candidate at any election, ran way behind his ticket and argue that it was the height of absurdity to nominate a weak candidate when it was absolutely necessary to nominate a candidate of exceptional strength. The Cleveland faction also oppose Parker, principally on account of the fact that his nomination would greatly strengthen Hill's power. Some of the most rabid Cleveland men go so far as to say they would rather see president Roosevelt re-elected than Hill restored to power in New York.

Tammany Leader Murphy has clearly defined his position in the matter and it cannot be doubted that a great many New York Democrats, not included in the Tammany fold, agree with the position he takes. Murphy has stated in private conversation, that he fully recognizes the fact that only an exceptionally strong candidate could expect to receive the support of the united Democratic factions in this state and that for that reason he favored the selection of a candidate strong enough to harmonize the various factions. He opposed Parker because he did not believe that he could carry New York and he favored Cleveland because he was confident that the latter could draw the largest vote of any candidate up to the present time.

The Tammany tiger is becoming restive under the restraint of the closed lid and is beginning to rebel against the continuance of the restrictive policy inaugurated by Mayor McClellan and his faithful commissioner McAdoo. When Mayor McClellan first expressed his intention of screwing down tight the lid, the gamblers, divekeepers and poolroom men so strongly represented in the Tammany ranks winked at one another and held their peace, confident that the new broom would soon wear off its roughness. Even McAdoo's

lieutenants seemed to be under the impression that the order to keep the lid down tight was not meant seriously and after a while they began to shut one eye occasionally when the chief was not looking. Their lukewarmness and passive resistance placed Commissioner McAdoo in an awkward position. Mayor McClellan did his best to impress upon him that the lid must be kept down and that he would be held responsible for the strictest enforcement of the order. Between the positive orders of the mayor and the carefully disguised opposition of his lieutenants Mr. McAdoo was placed in a peculiar position and when he found that there was neither any prospect that the mayor would relent nor that his subordinates would change their tactics, he did the only thing he could under the circumstances, by giving his lieutenants a strong hint that they would either have to obey orders or quit. Two of the assistants, preferring the good will of the Tammany props to the fulfillment of their duties, resigned. But that did by no means solve the difficulty. Commissioner McAdoo has since then discovered that his position is more difficult than ever. His efforts to find two men in the ranks of Tammany willing to take the vacant positions with the understanding to keep the lid down at all costs, have been without success up to the present and he understands perfectly well that to select his lieutenants from outside of Tammany would result in open rebellion and bitter war.
