ALICE PLAYED PONIES

Daughter of Roosevelt Photographed in Act of Betting on Races

Society Shocked and Brilliant Young Lady Exiled to New York

Washington, D. C., April 12.—Miss Alice Roosevelt has been exiled to New York, where she must stay till the Bennings racing season is over.

The young lady attended the races Saturday and yesterday Washington society was horrified to find pictures for sale in certain places depicting the young lady in the act of giving money to a commissioner, of showing her winnings triumphantly to Representative Gillett, of Massachusetts; of giving money to Representative Longworth, of Ohio, presumably to bet, and in two groups watching the horses running.

The results are manifold. Miss Roosevelt has been packed off to New York to remain there until the races are over.

The report also announces that the management of the Jockey Club has ordered that no more cameras shall be admitted to the Bennings track, and the President of the United States, through friends who went to the photographers, has suppressed the pictures.

The curious fact remains, however, that "society" is excited more over the fact that the young lady was "caught" by the photographer in the act of race track betting, than over the betting itself. But then modern society sees no wrong in doing just as it pleases, the only harm is in being caught or shown up in the deed.

EXONERATE HOUSE MEMBERS

McCall Committee Find That Congressman Have Not Grafted on Post Office Deals

Washington, D. C., April 12.—The much discussed report of the McCall committee, which investigated the charges against members of congress on the report recently given the house through the committee on postoffices, was submitted to the house today by McCall, of the investigating committee.

After discussing several cases in detail, the report, in conclusion, issues a clean bill of health to the members generally, saying that nothing has appeared to justify finding that any member of the house has profited financially in the slightest degree, or that any member was guilty of improper conduct in connection therewith.

The committee feels constrained, however to add that, in their opinion, it would be well to restrain within the narrowest limits the action of members in connection with post-offices, and in the details of other executive matters, and that the severance of such matters from work of that character would augment the efficiency of the house.

ATTORNEY KNOX OBJECTS

Springs a Surprise on Harriman Lawyers

St. Paul, Minn., April 12.—The motion of Harriman and Pearce for leave to file a petition in the intervention case of the United States merger against the Securities Company, seeking to get control of the Northern Pacific, is being heard in the United States court. This morning was occupied by the opening argument on behalf of plaintiffs by Maxwell Everts, who contended that, under the decree of the court, affirmed by the United States supreme court, the

petitioners are entitled to have returned to them the shares of stock of the Northern Pacific, or those into which they have been converted in exchange for shares of the Northern Securities Company which they held, and that defendants are to dispose of the stock in pursuance with the scheme of distribution, which would give the Hill interests stronger control over competing lines than ever.

A surprise was sprung on the Harriman attorneys by a notice handed to the court in behalf of Attorney-General Knox, objecting to the proposed intervention. Attorney Knox states that the United States stands on the decree as affirmed, and submits that the court is only concerned in so far that it is faithfully observed by defendants according to its terms. The Hill attorneys were also shocked by an intimation from Judge Sanborn to the effect that the court might be appealed to on the presumption that Hill is ready to launch another "holding corporation" as soon as the security is dissolved.
