DEERE PLOWMAN Is Now in Salem From a Trip to the Orient Tells About Conditions in Manila and Japan--Farming in American Style

C. H. Deere, president of the John Deere Plow company of Moline, Ill., & Ferguson, local agents of the company.

Mr. Deere is returning from a three months' trip to the Orlent, where he went on a pleasure tour. "I left home in January and sailed from San Francisco," said he yesterday in talking to a Journal reporter, "and I have had a delightful vacation. We touched at Manila, where I spent several days and found everything pleasant and agreeable in the islands. The health of the Americans who are I did not hear any complaints on account of the climate. I next went to the Grand canal on a house boat.

These boats are furnished in regular hotel style, have an interpreter, cook, captain and a crew of 11 sailors. The canal is 160 miles long, and the house boats are towed by tugs, each tug handling six or eight boats. It took our party a week to make the trip,

but it was well worth the while. The bridges, the majority of them being built hundreds of years ago out of stone, and they are works of engineer-

ing, with their large arches. "We did not hear much of the way until we arrived in Japan, but in that

country everything was in a state of excitement. Troops were being hurried onto transports, bands played and the people cheered their departing veterans. The Japanese are very enthusiastic, and confidently believe that they will subdue the great Russian empire. While in Kobe we visited a public gymnasium, a large building, where hundreds of the little brown men were doing athletic work. About one-half of the building was covered with mats, and here a large number

## Wild West Show in England.




