## JOHN DEERE PLOWMAN

**Is Now in Salem From a Trip to the Orient**

**Tells About Conditions in Manila and Japan—Farming in American Style**

C. H. Deere, president of the John Deere Plow company of Moline, Ill., is in the city, the guest of Manning & Ferguson, local agents of the company.

Mr. Deere is returning from a three months' trip to the Orient, where he went on a pleasure tour. "I left home in January and sailed from San Francisco," said he yesterday in talking to a Journal reporter, "and I have had a delightful vacation. We touched at Manila, where I spent several days and found everything pleasant and agreeable in the islands. The health of the Americans who are located there seems to be good and I did not hear any complaints on account of the climate. I next went to Hong Kong, then to Shanghai, but the finest part of the trip was a voyage up the Grand canal on a house boat. These boats are furnished in regular hotel style, have an interpreter, cook, captain and a crew of 11 sailors. The canal is 160 miles long, and the house boats are towed by tugs, each tug handling six or eight boats. It took our party a week to make the trip, but it was well worth the while. The canal is crossed by hundreds of bridges, the majority of them being built hundreds of years ago out of stone, and they are works of engineering, with their large arches.

"We did not hear much of the war until we arrived in Japan, but in that country everything was in a state of excitement. Troops were being hurried onto transports, bands played and the people cheered their departing veterans. The Japanese are very enthusiastic, and confidently believe that they will subdue the great Russian empire. While in Kobe we visited a public gymnasium, a large building, where hundreds of the little brown men were doing athletic work. About one-half of the building was covered with mats, and here a large number were wrestling. On the other side fencing, spear exercises and numerous other sports were in progress, showing the inclination of the race to pursue vigorous athletic work. Our guide told us that over a million men, boys and women in Japan belonged to this athletic club.

"The people of Northern Japan are farming in the American style, and we are building up quite a trade, but in the central and southern part of the country the traditions are entirely different, and the farming is conducted by hand labor. This is due to the large population and to the methods of farming.

"We landed in Victoria on our re-

turn trip, and I have been on the Sound and in Portland for several days. This is my first visit to Oregon for 10 years, and I can notice large improvements in the cities and towns. About 30 years ago I made my initial voyage into Portland, coming up from San Francisco on the steamer. That was before the railroad was completed, but we sold goods here in those days. I like the coast, and always enjoy the time I spend here."

The John Deere Company is the largest plow factory in the world, turning out over 300,000 plows each year. It was founded by the elder Deere in 1846 at Moline, and has been a success from the start. The company also owns two carriage factories, and a corn planter factory, employing in the aggregate several thousand people.

Mr. Deere reports trade conditions better now than they were a year ago, and says that the presidential election is not affecting the business of the country in the least. Sales are large and collections good, an unusual thing for the year of a general election.

## Wedding of Captain Sartoris.

Paris, April 26.—The civil ceremony of the marriage of Captain Algernon Sartoris (grandson of the late General Grant) to Miss Germaine Cecile Noufflard (niece of Charles F. Haile, director of the New Gallery, London,) took place in Paris today. Major T. Bentley Mott, the United States military attaché, was one of the witnesses for the bridegroom. The religious ceremony will be performed Wednesday in the Church of St. Honore d'Eylau, and will be attended by all the members of the American colony, as well as many leaders of Parisian society.

## Wild West Show in England.

London, April 26.—Colonel Cody's Wild West show is booked to begin its season today at Stoke-on-Trent, and during the next six months the famous exhibition will be seen in the chief cities of the British Isles.

By way of keeping up to date Colonel Cody has added a number of new features, including 25 Japanese riders and an increased number of Cossacks.
