

DEALERS SEEM SATISFIED

Washington Firm Says Conditions Are Good for Large Crop and Fair Price

Herman Klaber, of Tacoma, was in the city yesterday looking over the hop situation, and visiting with old acquaintances. Mr. Klaber is a dealer, as well as owning a part interest in the Meeker yards, near Puyallup, Wash. The Meeker yards are the largest in that state, containing 132 acres, and average almost a ton to the acre every year. The yards are in a high state of cultivation and yield a very fine quality of hops. Mr. Klaber says the season in Washington is about three weeks later this spring than it is here, and the vines have scarcely commenced to grow.

Regarding the outlook for a price this year, Mr. Klaber feels confident that it will be fully equal to that of last season, and expects a good figure for the surplus crop of 1903. The firm of Klaber & Co. have about 1000 bales

Monster Bamboo Pole.

Dr. W. H. Davis, his brother, Chas. C. Davis, and J. Harvey Roberts returned from Newport yesterday noon after spending a very pleasant Sunday at the bay. They brought with them the largest bamboo pole ever seen here and told a story about finding it floating in on the crest of a wave, and riding it to shore. Mr. C. C. Davis, who had gone into the surf, had been carried out to sea, and was brought back by a pole, or tree. The bamboo pole when measured was found to be 88 feet long and measured four and a half inches in diameter at the largest end. It was covered with barnacles inside the butt end and the finders explained that it had come from the shores of far-away Cathay. A report received from others coming from Newport tells a different story, however. It is well known that Edwin Stone a year ago set out a bamboo plantation on his property at Seal Rocks, and the Newport story is to the effect that the three gentlemen made a raid on this plantation and appropriated this pole. Their original intention was to carry off a fishing rod or two, but when they found the big bamboo, decided to take it. Mayor Davis will erect it in his door yard for a flag pole, and will thus be enabled to sing "Under a Bamboo Tree" under his own tree. The big bamboo is now in the mayor's dooryard, where it was greatly admired by the neighbors yesterday.—Albany Democrat.

Salem's One Redwood.

In the midst of Summer street, north of Marion street, stands the only redwood tree in this city. Nearly three feet in diameter and fifty feet high. It was set out by Hon. Daniel Waldo in the sixties. The city council will probably take steps to protect it.

SAY HE TOOK MONUMENT

George H. Himes Accused of Removing Historical Astoria Relic

Astoria, Or., May 4.—George H. Himes, secretary of the Oregon Historical society, is accused of taking from Astoria the monument which marked the resting place of McTavish English representative, who was drowned off Fort Astoria in 1818. At the last meeting of the Chamber of Commerce it was decided to mark all historic spots in this vicinity apropos of the Lewis and Clark fair, and also to collect relics of early days. Discussion brought out the charge that Mr. Himes had carried off the monument of McTavish, who was here when Fort Astoria was taken over by English and renamed Fort George. He was drowned by the capsizing of a boat.

At last night's meeting of the Council a letter was read from President Welch of the Chamber of Commerce who requested the council to take such action as would insure the return of monument and cause the punishment of the person who carried it off. The council referred the matter to a committee and the City Attorney, who will demand that the monument be returned.

The body of McTavish was removed three times and finally buried in Hillside cemetery, from which Mr. Himes is said to have carried off the monument.
