HOPS
WERE
INJURED

Late Cold Rains and Frosts
Will Reduce Valley Crop
Several Thousand
Bales

Reports from various sections of the country are that the hop crop for the year will be far short of an average crop. In fact that the yield of 1934 will be at least one-third less than the usual output. This statement is made after a careful review of conditions throughout the Willamette valley, both upland and bottom yards, and after a careful talk with many growers during the past 10 days.

The long, cold wet winter has injured every yard in the valley to a certain extent, but, of course, many will suffer to a greater degree than others. The vines are weak and delicate, this being especially true in yards where large crops were raised last year.

A large Marion county yard that yielded almost a ton to the acre in 1933 will not be cultivated this year, unless the vines strengthen wonderfully during the next few days. At the present time the hills are in very poor condition, and the best posted hop men say that the yard will not pay for the cultivation and care.

Another large yard, that for several years has been a heavy producer, has almost one-half of the hills missing, and the yield will be cut in two at best. New yards that were well started last year are in good condition, and give promise for fine crops, but the new yards that were poorly cared for will be a total failure, according to the present outlook.

The growers are feeling the loss of the crop, and the country will miss the extra amount of cash that is distributed through it if present indications amount to much.

The late frost of several days ago contributed materially to the damage, but the main loss resulted from the late, cold rains.
