WAS AFTER MASTER**Portland Lawyer Tried to Hold the Schooner Manila****Portland Medical Concern Had Claim Against Captain Rose, But Warrant Was Not Served**

The four-masted schooner Manila sailed early Sunday morning for San Pedro, and thereby hangs a tale. Saturday night Sheriff Linville received a telephone message from Portland to the effect that a warrant for the arrest of Captain Louis M. Rose had been issued there, and that the sheriff would be requested to serve it. The vessel was expected down the river Saturday night, but she did not get down until Sunday morning. She proceeded at once to the mouth of the river, where she was lying at anchor when Deputy Sheriff Binder, accompanied by the lawyer representing the Portland parties, sought to make service.

Captain Rose's wife had been at a Portland sanitarium for treatment, and the medical institution had a claim against him for \$249.20. The warrant issued for the arrest of the master charged him with being an absconding debtor. Just why the warrant was not served at Portland is a mystery which has not been explained, and it is the opinion of the local authorities that the efforts of the claimants were directed toward the detention of the schooner. Deputy Sheriff Binder informed the lawyer that he would be able to serve the warrant if a launch were chartered to take him to the lower harbor, but the attorney was not anxious to incur the expense, so the schooner sailed away. Mrs. Rose is aboard the vessel, and will make the trip to San Pedro. The lawyer said he would seek to collect the amount upon the return of Captain Rose at some future date.

A Michael Angelo Found.

Berlin, May 25.—Professor Thode, of the university of Heidelberg, announces that he has discovered, in the church of San Spirito, at Florence, one of the earliest examples of Michael Angelo's handiwork, in the shape of a wooden crucifix, which was made for Piero di Medici between the years 1492 and 1494. The crucifix stands on the high altar between two figures of the Virgin Mary and of St. John. The church of San Spirito was renovated between the years 1600 and 1607, and the crucifix was then placed in the vestry.

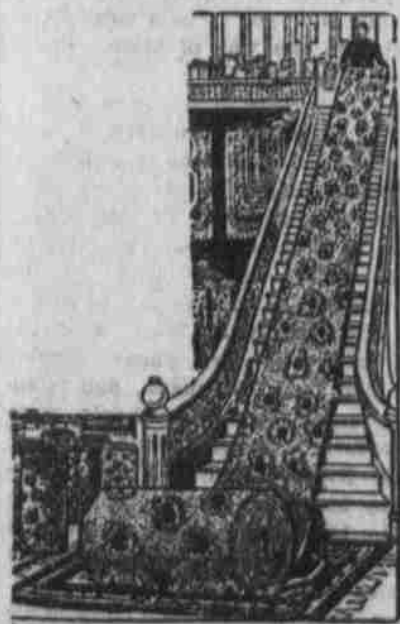
