A Great Musical Treat.

The writer was privileged to hear Mr. and Mrs. Sidney Hayes in a parlor concert Sunday evening that showed them to be grand entertainers on the piano, violin, mandolin and guitar. Prof. Hays is probably the best performer on the three stringed instrument mentioned that has ever located in Salem. It is hard to say on which he is the better. His violin playing is hearty and very expressive, he having the energy and manners of the Hungarian virtuoso, the immortal Remenyi. On the mandolin he taxes the fullest capacity of that instru-

ment, and on the guitar he is a complete master. This community is to be congratulated on such a man as Prof. Sidney Hayes coming here to live. As a young man he is one of the best turned out of the city of Chicago, where he ranked high in concert work, in orchestra, and as a teacher. He is an unassuming man but a thoroughly devoted musician, and Mrs. Hayes as his accompanist on the piano is a sweet player and sympathetic performer, with a broad scope of repertoire. Besides many difficult concert performances, Mr. and Mrs. Hayes rendered following favorite pieces:

"Carnival of Venice," "The Mocking Bird," "Ben Bolt," "The Barber of Seville," "Bohemian Girl," and "Flower Song," all with variations. As a soloist on either instrument Mr. Hayes has no superior in this city, and few equals among the professionals on the road.

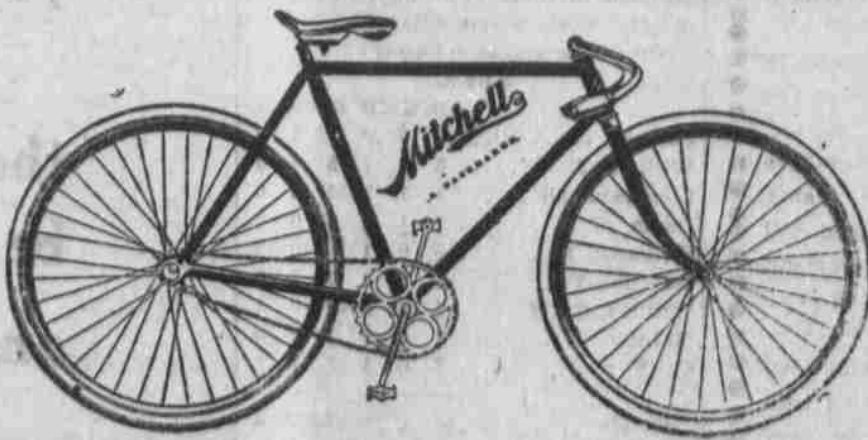
