Meeting at Woodburn
Last Evening Was
Largely Attended

Home Town of Democratic
Candidate for Judge Are
for Good Roads and
Economy

(Editorial Correspondence.)

Woodburn, June 1.—The candidates arrived here pretty well tired out. Three meetings a day, and traveling over the country roads is not a pleasure tour by any means.

At Silverton there was a good audience, with the band out, and the Republican speakers had the best of it. The crowd refused to stay to hear Judge Corby close, and he talked but a few minutes.

Huckenstein paid a high compliment to County Superintendent Moores and a funny story. The usual arguments were made, and nothing new was developed, except that Silverton Republicans are wide-awake.

At Scotts Mills, the home of S. Richle, the Republicans got a warm reception. The usual good dinner was served, and that intelligent community turned out a big crowd.

At Mt. Angel the St. Mary's band played for the delegates for official honors. In this Democratic stronghold Huckenstein opened, but did not get as warm a reception as Scott. In fact Scott has received great applause at all the places since the last report, and his boom is rapidly growing. At present there is no fight on the personnel of the ticket, outside of Kay any Scott, and not much on either of these gentlemen.

At Woodburn

There was a large assemblage of voters at Association hall. A few ladies were out, but almost no children. A mist had been falling all the evening, and this had precipitated into a drizzle, and finally a fine rain gave the parched fields a good soaking, producing prosperity at a rapid rate.

The program was cut down to four principal speakers, Kay and Huckenstein, Scott and Corby. Graham and Settlemyer were introduced and spoke but a few minutes each. As the campaign nears its close these gentlemen are fighting the party battles.

Jas. W. Culver, for sheriff, has not made a "treating campaign." He has spent some money for cigars, and at one place bought some soda water. He has not carried on an expensive campaign, as some candidates for sheriff have done.

Fred Rice, the Republican candidate for assessor, has made a gentlemanly campaign and a very favorable impression. He is a fine business man, and a man of the middle-class, being neither rich nor poor. As a business man and property owner he will do the fair thing by all classes, and no better man could be chosen to that office.

T. B. Kay won great applause for his sturdy fight against extravagant clerk hire and grafting appropriations in general. He showed that he had saved thousands of dollars by defeating single resolutions to extend the time and pay of employees.

Judge Scott nailed the statement as a lie that he had put \$200 in his pocket on the purchase of a road roller. He defied any man to stand before a public audience and show where a dollar of graft had been carried on in the past four years by the county commissioners' court. (Great applause.) The taxpayers would nail as a lie the statement that he or his colleagues had taken a dollar from the taxpayers illegally. This was again heartily applauded, and at no place has Judge Scott spoken so well as at Woodburn, or been more cordially received than in the home of his opponent.

The hand-clapping brigade was out in full force on both sides. Hal Patton captain for the Republicans and Chairman Vaughn for the Democrats.
