SHOT WITH RIFLE

H. F. McIlwain of Albany Meets With Very Serious Accident

Mr. and Mrs. H. F. McIlwain were returning from a trip to Cascadia today when they stopped awhile before noon for their lunch, and to water their horse. While waiting Mr. McIlwain set up a target, and Mrs. McIlwain shot at it with a 22-calibre smokeless gun with a dry bullet. The bullet hit a twig, and, glancing, struck Mr. McIlwain in the abdomen two inches below the heart. They got into their wagon as soon as possible, and Mr. McIlwain drove most of the way home himself as fast as the horse could run. He walked into Dr. Ellis' office, and Dr. Ellis and Dr. Wallace probed for the bullet, later being assisted by Dr. Davis, but it could not be found. Mr. McIlwain weighs 290 pounds, and probing was difficult. He was taken to Mrs. Neeland's hospital,

and everything possible is being done, but the case is serious.—Albany Democrat.
