MINTO ISLAND GRAVEL

May Lead to a Lawsuit for City and Owners

The city council met in adjourned session last evening. In the absence of Mayor Waters Alderman Hubbard presided.

The committee appointed to consider the Minto gravel bar matter reported as follows:

"Your committee to whom was referred the matter of what legal proceedings would be advisable for the city to take to prevent further interference with the street commissioner in the removal of gravel from the gravel bar under the grant from John Minto and wife to the city, beg to report

"That we consulted John A. Carson in reference to the rights of the city, and in reference to prevention of further interference with such rights, and his opinion in relation thereto is annexed.

"That the grant to the city is clear and definite, and should not be changed in any way, and the city should maintain its rights. We recommend that the street commissioner be instructed to proceed to remove gravel from the bar in accordance with such grant, and that if any person threaten or attempt to interfere with the removal of gravel or with the street commissioner or any officer or employee of the city in removing gravel, that a suit be commenced by the city to prevent such interference; and that a committee of three be appointed by the mayor with authority to direct and employ John A. Carson, an attorney, to commence a suit in behalf of the city against all persons who shall interfere with the street commissioner or other officer or employee of the city. "Also that the recorder notify the street commissioner to proceed to remove gravel from said gravel bar to be used on the streets and highways of the city, and also notify John W. Minto, H. P. Minto and D. C. Minto that the city of Salem, Oregon, will not agree to any change of the grant, but will insist upon and protect its rights under it in every particular."

Carson's Legal Opinion.

"At your request I have investigated the rights of the city of Salem to take gravel from the bar in the Willamette river near the Salem Flouring Mill. The indenture of grant executed by Mr. and Mrs. John Minto to the city of Salem is not a model of conveyancing, but, nevertheless, in my opinion, it grants to the city the absolute right to take from the bar such gravel as may be needed on the streets of this city. However, the city would not have the right to use the gravel for any other purpose, nor to sell or dispose of the same to third parties.

"The act of interfering with the officers of the city in taking the gravel is a violation of the rights of the city, and in my opinion a civil suit would best protect the interests of the city, and accordingly, if the acts of interference be repeated, or should a disposition be shown to oppose the officers of the city in taking gravel from the bar, a suit should be instituted."

The report elicited considerable discussion, but was adopted. H. P. Minto, one of the owners of the island, was present, and addressed the council.

The council adopted the plans submitted for the improvement of Marion square by the Woman's League. The only change was made along the Commercial street side. The plans called for a curved walk, but the council did not deem it advisable to order that kind, and in lieu substituted a straight walk.
