## SUES RAIL ROAD

Mr. James H. Penland Asks  
\$5,000 Damages From  
Southern Pacific

J. H. Penland has commenced an action against the Southern Pacific company for \$5000 for the killing of his wife at the crossing of that railroad on South Commercial street in this city on Sunday, May 29th. Turner & Inman are attorneys for plaintiff.

The accident is well remembered, and caused general regret. Mrs. Penland was returning from church, and, while attempting to cross the railroad track, was crushed between two freight cars, and died instantly. The train was switching at the time, and the cars between which deceased passed were very close together. The railroad men claim that she was warned not to pass between the cars, and other testimony will be introduced to show that the crossing was unguarded. The case will be watched with considerable interest.

## The Country Nasbys.

The fourth-class postmasters of Marion county are to meet in this city Saturday, and hold a convention.

They are a class of public servants who are very little appreciated, but who render a very important service.

The compensation of fourth-class postmasters is hardly worth being called by that name. It is a commission.
