## Companies Are Reported to Have Merged Their Interests

New York, July 21.-It is said on good authority that the plan for the merger of the National Lead company and the United Lead company will be favorably acted upon at today's meeting of the directors of the National Lead company and that the deal will be consummated at an early date. Reports have been current at different times during the last two years that the rival lead interests would get together. Negotiations have at times been held looking to such a result Each time, however, they came to naught, and the rivalry became bitter. It seems khat it was this rivalry which was directly responsible for bringing the two interest together.

It is believed that in the proposed merger the National will take over only the manufacturing plants of its rival, and that the mining interests owend by the Guggenheim-Ryan combine-which also controls the United Lead comapny-will be otherwise disposed of.
