COLD LEAD DEAL

Companies Are Reported to Have Merged Their Interests

New York, July 21.—It is said on good authority that the plan for the merger of the National Lead company and the United Lead company will be favorably acted upon at today's meeting of the directors of the National Lead company and that the deal will be consummated at an early date. Reports have been current at different times during the last two years that the rival lead interests would get together. Negotiations have at times been held looking to such a result. Each time, however, they came to naught, and the rivalry became bitter. It seems that it was this rivalry which was directly responsible for bringing the two interest together.

It is believed that in the proposed merger the National will take over only the manufacturing plants of its rival, and that the mining interests owned by the Guggenheim-Ryan combine—which also controls the United Lead company—will be otherwise disposed of. If this plan is carried out the mining properties of the United Lead company will probably be turned over to the American Smelting and Refining company, which is also controlled by the Guggenheim-Ryan people.

Salmon Are Running. Astoria, Or., July 21.—For the time this year there is a good run of salmon entering the river, and around Sand Island yesterday and last night the gillnetters made good catches, showing an improvement on the catch of several hundred per cent. Whether it is only a spurt of a day or two, or the beginning of a big run, is not known, but the latter is believed to be true by many, as this is the time that the run in Monterey Bay was expected.

The pack at the present time, on a basis of 48 falls to the case, is not over 100,000 cases, which is about the same as it was at this time last year, and if a good run comes and continues, an average pack will be put up. The cold storage people are fully 80 per cent behind their pack of last year, and it will be impossible to catch up under any circumstances.

The size and quality of the present run are all that could be desired, and as the water in the river is clearing up rapidly the fish are expected to go up the river, and permit the nets to make some good catches for the first time during the present season. Greater preparations have been made this year than ever before to handle a great run, and if the opportunity offers some great records will be broken.
