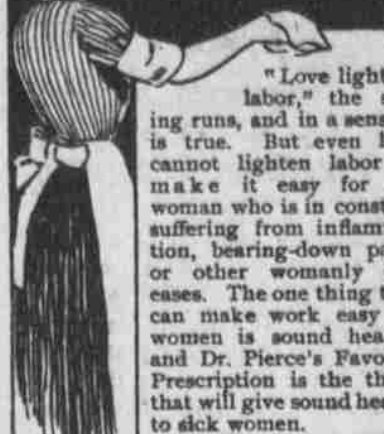

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LUMBER TRADE BRISK

Prices Have Advanced Materially During Last Two Weeks

"Prices are firmer, and there are more inquiries for lumber than for some time," says George D. Gerlinger, secretary-treasurer of the Oregon Fir Lumber Company. The Gerlingers have been operating a sawmill at Barton, in Clackamas county, on the line of the Oregon Water Power Company's railway for the past two or three years, but recently sold their large holdings in that section to Eastern parties. They are the owners of the Salem, Falls City & Western railway, that has completed a line from Dallas to Falls City, and are now having the plans made for a new sawmill at the terminus of the line at the latter place. Mr. Gerlinger said: "The new mill will have a capacity of about 50,000 feet daily, and we have a lot of the finest timber in Oregon, principally fir."

Mr. Gerlinger appeared confident that lumber would soon advance in price, and said: "During the past two weeks lumber has advanced from 50 cents to \$1.50 per thousand on the Sound, and conditions have been much worse there than here. The lumber yards generally are getting short on stock, and on the slightest advances in prices will rush to fill up, and the demand will cause a still greater demand. There has been a falling off in the output of lumber during the past few months, although the mills in Portland have continued to operate steadily. The loggers should effect an organization, and do business more systematically. The present condition here is only a repetition of what occurred in the East in the past, and if the lumbermen were organized there would be less cutting on outside shipments, and the prices of lumber would keep up."

Mr. Gerlinger takes an optimistic view of the situation, and says that people hold back during a presidential campaign from force of habit, and it affects commercial conditions.
