GREAT WATER POWER

Sandy River Will Furnish All That Is Needed for Salem Road

The large interests which secured land for a power station and rights of way for an extended canal or flume for harnessing the power of the Sandy river, near the mouth of Bull Run, have men over the right of way every day, cutting brush, says the Oregonian. A surveyor has also been at work. From this source it is announced, the proposed new electric railway between Portland and Salem will get its power. Ten acres belonging to R. Thomas on Sandy near Bull Run were purchased about a year ago for the power station, and J. Spain's ranch was also purchased outright. Rights of way have been secured up the Sandy to Alder Creek, a distance of about seven and one-half miles, and it is estimated that a great fall, about 300 feet, will be secured at the power station or end of the flume.

The 10 acres secured for the station is about 24 miles from Portland, which is less than the distance to Cazadero, where the Oregon Water Power & Railway Company will get its power from the Clackamas river. The work of putting in the power station on the Thomas land will probably be started as soon as it is settled that the proposed Portland-Salem railway will be built.

According to the surveyors and estimates a great power may be developed out of the Sandy, owing to the great fall between Alder Creek and the location of the power station on the Thomas land. There are no difficulties in the way of constructing a canal or flume. All the power needed to operate an electric railway between Portland and Salem can be obtained by harnessing the Sandy river. The purchasers of the Thomas land and rights of way have kept one or more men at work on the ground ever since the purchase was made.

UNITED STATES CAUTIOUS

Will Not Be in Any Haste Regarding Seizures

Washington, July 29.—At today's meeting the recent developments in the Russo-Japanese war, relative to the seizure of contraband goods shipped from the United States was a fruitful topic. The disposition manifested was to go slow about making protests to St. Petersburg in the case of the Arabia, until all the facts were ascertained. It was Secretary McCall's first appearance at a cabinet meeting.

FRISCO PEOPLE REJOICE

San Francisco, July 29.—The agents of the steamer Arabia, which was seized by the Russians, received a cablegram today, confirming the arrival at Vladivostok of the captured vessel in charge of a prize crew. There are no details of the capture. Great rejoicing exists in the local marine insurance and shipping circles over the escape of the steamer Korea. Confidence is partially destroyed, and risks are loosening somewhat. The Mongolia, with a cargo valued at \$1,500,000, sailed for Yokohama this afternoon.

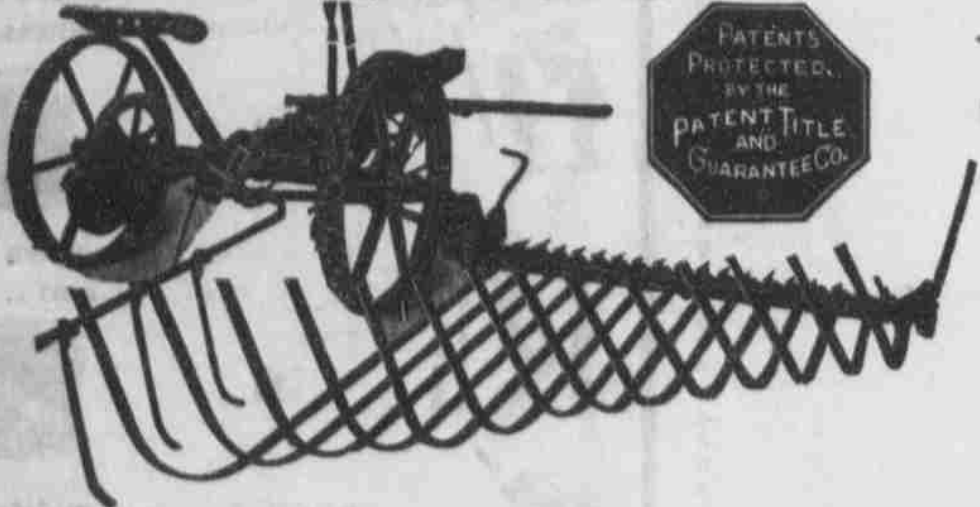
