TEST CASE FILED

J. E. Murphy Commences Suit to Annul Greater Salem Charter

J. E. Murphy has commenced a suit to enjoin County Assessor Lembecke, County Clerk Roland, Sheriff Culver and the city of Salem from levying a tax against his property situated inside of the present city limits of Salem. The suit was filed late Saturday afternoon and is brought for the purpose of testing the new charter of the city. W. H. Holmes and M. E. Pogue are attorneys for the plaintiff.

The complaint alleges that the plaintiff is the owner of 20 acres of land near the fair grounds, and if the defendants are allowed to enter his name and property on the tax roll that he will suffer heavy loss, and asks that they be perpetually enjoined from so doing.

Plaintiff owns 20 acres of land used for a tile works south of the fair grounds and is within the new city limits as defined by the charter passed at the session of 1903. The move has been under way for several months and is a concerted action on the part of a number of property owners in the new wards who are dissatisfied with the new charter. It is said a purse of \$1000 has been raised to push the suit and it is likely that it will be carried to the supreme court in the event that the decision is unfavorable to the plaintiff in the lower court.

STORMY COUNCIL SESSION

Park Board Money Will Be Used to Improve Cottage Street

After a stormy session of the city council Saturday evening the amendment offered by Alderman Gesner, taking away the balance of money now in the hands of the park board for the purpose of improving Cottage street, was adopted by a vote of 7 to 5. The vote in detail on the amendment was as follows:

Ayes—Walker, Acheson, Churchill, Crossan, Gesner, Hubbard, Hughes—7 Noes—Bayne, Catlin, Jacobs, Young, Downing—5.

The resolution offered by Alderman Downing provided for improving the street to receive the new Breyman fountain. The resolution led to a hot debate, in which every member of the council indulged.

The argument was advanced that Mr. Breyman had offered to install the fountain free of charge to the city and that it had been accepted under that condition. Now to appropriate \$500 from the treasury would not be a justice to the taxpayers and that the city was in need of the funds for other work.

On the other side it was contended that it was a great improvement and as it was furnished free of charge to the city it should be accepted under the new conditions. The resolution was finally adopted as amended and the park board will be short of funds for the remainder of the year.

The council was also notified that J. E. Murphy had commenced a suit to test the new charter and the mayor was empowered to employ attorneys to conduct the defense.

The bid of the Citizens' Light & Traction company for furnishing light for the city at \$6.50 per light per month was continued.

Liquor licenses were granted J. P. Rogers at 160 State street and 102 Court street.

The committee on street was ordered to notify the Salem Flouring Mills company to cover the Front street ditch.

Street Commissioner Tarpley was instructed to open the bridge on Church and Mill streets.

The new street numbering ordinance, as published elsewhere, was read twice and referred to the street committee.

The ordinance providing for the extension of Court street was referred.

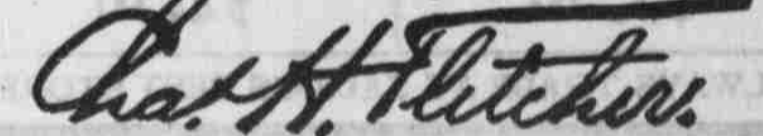
