Lincoln, Neb., Aug. 10.—Keen interest is manifested in the state conventions of the Democrats and Populists in session here today. Considerable difficulty is expected also in bringing about a satisfactory basis for fusion with the Populists on the state ticket. Still another interesting feature of the convention is that relating to the indorsement of a candidate for the United States senate. The Republicans have made the challenge by formally nominating in state convention a candidate for the senatorship. Whether the Democrats will accept the challenge by indorsing Mr. Bryan for the senate is as yet undecided.

FAMILY GROWS FAST

Sellwood Couple Have Three Pair of Twins in Five Years

Five children in one family, the oldest being 4 years old does not look like race suicide, and President Roosevelt would smile a broad smile were he to hear that such a family existed in Portland says the Telegram.

Mr. and Mrs. Christopher Kutz, of Sellwood, are still a young couple, both being on the sunnyside of 30. They have a good-sized family started in their little home where Tacoma avenue crosses the Southern Pacific tracks, and the neighbors are quite proud of them. Three pairs of twins within five years have blessed the Kutz family, but one of the oldest twins died at the age of a few months, so the galaxy of little ones has been reduced in number to five. The most recent pair of twins are 2 weeks old.

The Kutz family is very poor, and occupies a little box-house beside the railroad track, where a crossing sign suggests "Look out for the locomotive when the bell rings."

While three little children, two girls and a boy, play about the kitchen floor, the mother, a stout German woman, busies herself with the latest pair of twins in the next room. She cannot speak a word of English.

Mr. Kutz is a laboring man in the employ of the Sellwood sawmill, at \$2 a day. He goes to work, two miles away, regularly; is sober and industrious, but the wages have to be carefully husbanded in order to cover the family expenses.

The little home belongs to the family, however, and so the proud possessors of the five little ones live rent-free.

The Kutz family came from that portion of Russia bordering on Germany, five years ago, so the little ones are all Americans. Previous to leaving the old country, three children were born to them, but did not survive the ills of infancy.
