EUROPE NEEDS RAIN

Hop Crop Will Suffer Great Damage From the Dry Weather

In a personal letter to The Journal the well-known firm of Bernard Bing, of Nurnberg, Germany, the leading European hop dealer, says:

"In spite of the tropical heat and in defiance of the lack of any rain, from which the whole continent is suffering, the hop plant, both in Bavaria and in Bohemia, has kept rather well so far. The vine is still looking healthy and vigorous and has reached the top of the pole; burr is abundant."

"Heavy rains, however, are needed urgently, for in some plantations with sandy ground the leaves of the lower part of the plant are getting yellow."

"Owing to the dryness, demand for the 1903 growth is very good and prices, which, in spite of the small stock, had declined very much at the beginning of the month, have reached again their former level."

Baracas in Convention.

St. Louis, Mo., Aug. 11.—The eighth annual convention of the Young Men's Baraca Bible classes of America began today in the Delmar avenue Baptist church with M. A. Hudson of Syracuse, founder of the order, presiding. The sessions will last two days. An interesting program has been arranged for the open meeting tonight which will be in charge of R. N. Simms, of Raleigh, N. C. Other prominent participants in the convention are Dr. J. William Ott of Grand Rapids, Mich., Prof. B. M. Taber of Fort Collins, Colo., Rev. W. W. Burks of Mason City, Ia., Rev. Dr. W. J. Williamson of St. Louis, and Dr. Joseph Broughton of Atlanta, Ga. The Baraca classes were first formed in Syracuse, N. Y., in 1890, since that time the membership has increased to over 100,000. Reports to the present convention show that the growth in membership has been especially notable through the west and south.

Want Pest House Moved.

People living in and around Corvallis are raising many protests against the pest house which is situated close to the town. Many of the people living near will not come down the road past it, and this necessitates taking a much longer route. The citizens say it is too close, and are appealing to the city authorities to have it removed to some distant point. There is one patient, St. Bradley, a section foreman, confined there now with the smallpox.
