BALLIET GETS NEW TRIAL

Baker City Mining Promoter Will Answer for Fraud

Des Moines, Iowa, Aug. 13.—Letson Balliet, contrary to expectations, will be tried November 22 for mining stock swindles he is alleged to have committed. When the daring promoter was granted a new trial in the circuit court at St. Louis it was thought that he had heard the last of federal prosecutions and the case would be allowed to die a natural death.

Today, upon the application of United States Attorney Lewis Miles, Judge Smith McPherson ordered a second trial to be held during the second week of the November term of the United States court here. Postal authorities also announce that they intend to push the prosecution and land Balliet in prison if possible.

The entire session will be given over to a second investigation of the White Swan mining stock business, and witnesses will again be summoned from California and Oregon to testify.

Jail sentence was imposed on the promoter, but he is now in San Francisco on bond.
