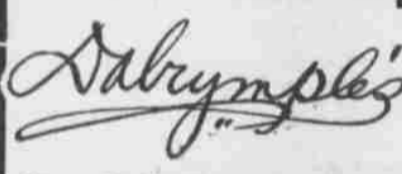

FIERCE FIRE RAGING

Aberdeen, Scotland, Aug. 13.—A fierce fire is raging in the tenement district and the damage already exceeds \$1,000,000.

BRYAN LOSES CASE

New Haven, Conn., Aug. 13.—A decision adverse to W. J. Bryan in his contest over the will of the late P. S. Bennett, of New York, and this city, was handed down yesterday by the supreme court of errors. The decision virtually denies that Mr. Bryan is entitled to the \$50,000 mentioned in the sealed letter written by Mr. Bennett and addressed to his widow, which was to be read by her after his death. By this letter, the widow was asked to give \$50,000 to Mr. Bryan and his family.

The decision sustains the opinion given by the superior court in the case last spring, and also the decision of the probate court before which the matter was brought up. No opinion was filed with the decision which was given by Chief Justice Torrance. Justices Hall, Hammersley, Baldwin and Prentice concurred.

Bryan not Talkative.
Indianapolis, Ind., Aug. 13.—W. J. Bryan was in Indianapolis last night on his way to Freeport, O. When told of the decision of the Connecticut supreme court of appeals he declined to discuss the matter further than to say: "It was a close question to decide."
