ANOTHER BANKING HOUSE

Col. L.K. Page and As ociates will Open a New Institution

It is now known that Salem is to have another banking institution in the near future, and it is believed by those who know the moving spirits in the matter that it will be an institution that will prove a credit and a great benefit to our community. Thile they are strong concerns, and a credit to any city, the new concern believes there is room for another without encroaching upon the business of those already here.
