CITY FINANCE REPORT

Recorder's Monthly and Quarterly Reports Filed

The report of City Recorder Judah of the business transacted in the office and courts under his charge, during the month of September, which was presented to the council on Tuesday evening, and referred to the ways and means committee, shows that the total amount of the cash receipts was \$855.49, and the warrant expenditures \$1662.21. There was a total number of 50 cases in the recorder's court during the month, from which a total of \$85 in fines was collected, the balance being served out under commitments aggregating 170 days.

In the justice court there were two cases, the justice fees amounting to \$7.70, and the constable's fees to \$5.60.

The quarterly report of the recorder for the three months ending September 30th, is given herewith in full.
