C., Oct. 7 .- The Naional convention of the United Boys' Brigade began in this city today with an attendance of nearly 2,000 delegates representing the 50,000 members of the organization. The convention will continue three days. In addition to the transaction of business affairs. the program will include excursions, athletic sports, competitive drills. and a parade of 1,500 uniformed boys. Today the boys were given a ride down the Potomac, returning in time to participate in a program of athletic sports. 
