### C. F. Lansing Holds a Full Hand and a Long Suit of Fine Trees

A reporter of The Journal enjoyed a visit the other day to the Quaker Nursery, which is situated just east of this city, a short distance off the Garden Road. The proprietor, Mr. C. F. Lansing, has about 60 acres in nursery stock and with an experience of about 15 years, he can truthfully say that he has never grown as fine a quality of young trees as he has this year. Throughout the long dry season, he kept his nursery under the highest cultivation and not only got a fine growth of wood and vine, but it is all well matured and ripened. Many of his year old trees are as large as ordinary two year olds. The beauty about his nursery stock from the standpoint of the retail trade is, that buyers get every order filled right fresh out of the ground. The Quaker Nurseries include almost every hardy and successful variety of fruit trees, nut trees, evergreen trees, grape vines, roses and small fruits, together with ornamental and flowering shrubs and climbers.

We forgot to mention the new Camber pear, which is said for quality and flavor to surpass anything ever produced in the pear line. Mr. Lansing of the Quaker Nurseries, is widely known and has a reputation for generous treatment of his trade.
