

Our soldiers ceased firing, and were immediately met by a volley which knocked a dozen men over. Our men were furious enough to batcher their own parents. They surrounded the Japanese and slaughtered every one of them, giving no quarter. The next night a similar incident occurred. But hearing the treacherons words, We are Russians," our men refused to cease firing. Luckily their shooting was bad, for the 'Japs,' instead of shooting back, groaned and swore in onmistakable genuine Russian. When we got over to them we found that we had been firing on our own men. A number were severely wounded.""
