New York Awaits Results.

New York, Nov. 7.—New York, in common with the rest of the country, is on edge in anticipation of tomorrow's election. Never in the history of the metropolis has a national political campaign been followed with more intense interest or the results more eagerly awaited than in the case of the campaign just closed, the widespread talk of general apathy to the contrary notwithstanding. Several things have combined to cause this extraordinary interest on the part of the people. The Presidential candidates of the two leading parties hail from this state, and the moving forces of the campaign throughout the entire country have been directed from the political headquarters in this city. During the last month or six weeks the heaviest oratorical artillery of both the Democrats and Republicans have been brought to bear on the city and state, and almost nightly Madison Square Garden, Carnegie hall and other big meeting places of Greater New York have echoed with campaign oratory and the shouts of enthusiastic partisans. To the lively interest manifested in the national campaign has been added the fierce intensity of the conflict for state offices. Night after night the candidates for governor, lieutenant governor and other state offices, together with the oratorical henchmen of both parties, have been heard in various quarters of the metropolis, from Staten Island to the Bronx, stump speakers have been heard on every corner and bands and fireworks have been used to the limit.

Today all of this campaign activity has ended and candidates and party managers are resting on their oars awaiting the results of the battle at the polls. The national committee headquarters are practically deserted, the leaders from out of town having departed for their homes to vote, leaving the local managers to finish the work and close up shop. Few of the leaders of authority or prominence could be found today to give a forecast on the result of the election. Those who were to be seen contented themselves with repeating the confident predictions which have emanated from headquarters for weeks past. The Republican leaders went over the same array of figures which proved to their own satisfaction that Roosevelt will be re-elected by an overwhelming plurality and that Higgins, the Republican candidate for governor of New York, has a walkover for the place. The same feeling of confidence in the result pervades the Democratic atmosphere. Charles F. Murphy, the Tammany leader, appears sure of Herlick's election to the governorship, and says that all signs point to the election of Judge Parker to the Presidency. But as the New York Herald points out, the people will have to decide, and tomorrow will tell the tale.

Roosevelt to Vote at Oyster Bay.

Washington, D. C., Nov. 7.—President Roosevelt, accompanied by Secretary Loeb and two executive clerks will leave the capital tonight for Oyster Bay. As soon as the members of the party have voted tomorrow morning they will return to Washington.

In accordance with custom and as an act of courtesy to the President, the telegraph companies will run special wires into the executive offices at the white house for the receipt of the election returns tomorrow night. The same courtesy will be extended to
