

DOWIE HAS NEW RIVAL

Colfax, Wash., Nov. 8.—Dowie and others of the newer brands of prophets have a rival in the person of "Dug-Out Pete," herald of the millennium and apostle of the truth, whose real name is Henry Biot and claims Roslyn, Wash. as his home.

"Dug-Out" was in this section lately and dug into the people with a lengthy tale of his search for truth and the final discovery of the source of this much abused and little used article. Like a true prophet he began his researches early—20 long years ago—and, according to his story, he is now 26. Naturally his was no common childhood, for at the early age of six he perceived that there was something wrong with the world and he immediately began to look for the cause and to seek to rectify it. The search was continued for 20 long years and not until a few weeks ago did he discover that nature is truth. Filled with joy and excitement over the discovery, he set out from Portland, thence to Pendleton and then to Colfax and here, being fully convinced, he decided to share his discovery with the world.

"Dug-Out's" theory is that all men are liars, that each man knows that the other is a liar, that every man when he lies is perfectly aware of the fact that he lies, and that an understanding of these conditions will result in the abolishment of lies, and from then on truth will reign universal and the millennium will come. Freedom for Diamond Queen.
Atlanta, Ga., Nov. 8.—Mamie de Cris, famous all over the country as the "diamond queen," will be freed from the Georgia penitentiary tomorrow, when her term of imprisonment will expire. This young woman first acquired a reputation by the marvelous tales she related while a guest at a hotel in this city. These tales, dealing with imaginary runaway accidents in which prominent persons were said to have been injured, attracted much attention, and through them she gained a great deal of notoriety. This notoriety proved unhelpful for her, however, as it led to her arrest. The publication of her picture in an Atlanta paper fell under the eye of a jewelry firm in Savannah, which had been cleverly defrauded out of valuable diamonds and other jewelry and they recognized the picture as that of the young woman who had perpetrated the swindle. An investigation followed and Mamie de Cris was arrested, tried, convicted and sent to the state farm at Milledgeville.

A little later she again leaped into public notice on account of a whipping given her by the prison official. Several of the prison employees lost their positions as a result of the investigation following the disclosure. Women May Decide.

Washington, Nov. 8.—An interesting feature of today's national election, and one the importance of which is not generally appreciated is the part played by the women voters in the four states where they exercise the full rights of suffrage. These states are Colorado, Wyoming, Idaho and Utah. The registration of women voters in these states amounted to about one hundred thousand—a number easily sufficient to turn the tide of battle toward either political party. The labor troubles in Colorado and the Mormon question which is agitating Utah, Wyoming and Idaho are the two issues in which the women voters have taken keen interest and which are expected to bring out a much larger feminine vote than at any previous election since women were granted the national American Woman Suffrage association.

London, Nov. 8.—Lord Rothschild, the well-known banker and financier, celebrated his sixty-second birthday today. He was the recipient of congratulations from many members of the nobility and other persons of prominence.

Nathan Meyer Rothschild was born in Piccadilly, London, on November 8, 1842. He is a son of Baron Lionel Nathan de Rothschild and a grandson of Nathan Meyer de Rothschild, of Frankfurt, the founder of the celebrated banking house. He was educated at Trinity college, Cambridge, and was a member of Parliament for Aylesbury from 1865 to 1885.

Retirement of Admiral Wise.
Washington, Nov. 8.—Rear Admiral W. C. Wise, having today reached the age limit of 64 years, was placed on the retired list. The retirement of Admiral Wise removes one of the few remaining veterans of the navy who saw active service in the '60s. He is succeeded as commander in chief of the training squadron by Captain R.
