RESULT OF IMMATURE MED DING.

Oregon had a fairly good local opinion law, as all men know who had lived in other states. Oregon had better conditions and less liquor traffic than most states in the Union.

But the professional agitators who had made a business of this kind, and who had been in the state for years, saw an opportunity to get jobs in Oregon, where the people seemed unsophisticated and easy gone.

So the lawless, like Tolls and McKee, and others proceeded to make a business of about all that the good people would stand for. That program was sprung last June, and was worked out in November.

The result is that the good old local opinion law was overthrown, and many towns have been opened to the licensed saloon that never before would grant a license.

All this is the result of half-baked theories, well meaning, but they have been allowed to prostitute a good cause for political purposes.

FIGHT FOR BETTER STREETS.

Owing to the inability of citizens to agree as to what kind of permanent street improvements were desired, this city has wasted another year with the old-fashioned gravel improvements.

The street committee and the street commission have expended another year's income from street taxes on spreading gravel, and most of it will be carted off in the spring.

These officials are not to be blamed for doing this, as prominent citizens demanded it of them and there was nothing else to do under the laws and system now in vogue.

But the time has come for this city to take a step forward and make a break for permanent streets. Asphalt, bitulite pavement or more broken rock with a coating of fine granite or sand are infinitely better.

The cost of good street improvement will be more than paid back the first year in increased rents, greater value of property, finer appearance of our city, and cleaner and better sanitary conditions.

No man should be elected to a city office or to the city council who is indifferent to better streets, or who has

The work can and should be started this winter, and there should be at least two prominent modern thorough lanes before the next year rolls around.

London, May, 10.—Archbishop Agius the newly appointed apostolic delegate to the Philippines, is among the passengers sailing today on the steamer Minutanka for New York. Upon arriving in America Father Agius will proceed at once to Washington to confer with President Roosevelt prior to resuming his voyage to Manila.

Father Agius was educated in England and is well known here. Those best acquainted with him express the opinion that he is likely to give a small aid in the pacification of the Philippines. He has led a busy, varied life in England, in Egypt, in Italy and other countries, and has learned to take broad views of persons and things.
