## HOUND KILLED BY CAR

The large Scotch stag hound belonging to Mrs. E. S. Kingston was run over and killed by a Commercial street car last night, shortly after the fire alarm sounded. The dog was a huge beast, weighing probably 140 pounds, and the contact threw the car from the track, suspending traffic for some time. From accounts furnish to The Journal the dog was instantly killed, and no blame can be attached to the motor-man, for there was another man on the front of the car, and both were keeping a sharp lookout, as there were so many people getting on and off at every crossing that a vigilant watch was necessary, but the dog, which was of a dirty gray color, was so near the color of the ground that it was impossible to see him until it was too late to stop the car. He was lying between the rails with his back toward the car, and making no movement, and could easily be mistaken for a dark shadow at night. The dog was a valuable one, and family deeply regret its loss.
