DOUGLAS COUNTY COAL MINE

During the past week Secretary R. W. Penn, of the Umpqua Coal Company, spent several days at the company's property, near Elkton, says the Roseburg Review. He brought back some of the best coal specimens yet taken out there, being fully equal to the high grade blacksmith coal brought here from the East and sold at \$25 to \$30 per ton.

A comfortable house has just been built for the men working at the mine, and the development is in steady progress. Tunnels Nos. 4 and 5 are now being put in. Comparatively few people realize the magnitude of this enterprise. Title to some more land was recently secured, and the company's holdings now aggregate over 1200 acres. Prospect holes show that coal exists over practically the entire tract, and the regular development work shows the first vein maintains a thickness of nearly nine feet, including a strata of shale, and the coal grows better and cleaner as depth is reached. This development work alone is producing considerable quantities of good coal. Work has also been commenced for the development of the second vein, lying fully 200 feet below the first. This also has a thickness of about nine feet, and there is every reason to believe that it will show an even better quality of coal than the upper vein.

No stock is now being offered for sale by the company, and when any is again placed on the market it will probably be at not less than 25 cents per share. Transportation is now an important feature under consideration. Until the building of a railroad line can be secured, it may be necessary to use teams for hauling the high-grade blacksmith coal to drain for shipment. Its high value will doubtless justify the outlay. To connect with the proposed railroad line a cable tramway about 1 1/2 miles in length will have to be put in from the mine to the Umpqua river, and this will be operated on a gravity system.
