KILLED THEIR DECOYS

Billy Taylor, author and dispenser of the Taylor-made candies, and J. Frank Hughes, merchant, politician and alderman for the Fourth ward in the city of Greater Salem, went up the river on Saturday night for a duck hunt and other pleasures. They rode the bouncing billows in the craft Oregonia, stopping at Buena Vista for the night and intending to float down the river in a canoe to this city, killing and slaughtering all kinds of ducks en route.

They arrived at the little historic burg which is nestled cozily alongside of the placid waters of the Willamette, but for some unknown reason this was the last that was heard from them until Monday noon when they reached home, wet, cold, tired, hungry and without game, although they were due to get back Sunday afternoon.

When accosted by a Journal reporter the pair were very reticent and protested that they had nothing to say, but a "friend" volunteered the following information:

"You see, it was like this," said he, "Frank and Billie have been planning the trip for several weeks and they had it all figured out just how they could overstock the game market. They purchased half a dozen fine big ducks and were going to use them as decoys. They admitted that it was a mean trick, but as everything is considered fair in love and war, they cleared their consciences by figuring that it was a case of the former."

"But when they got up the river those pesky decoy ducks seemed to be onto the racket and gave the distress sign. The big mallards would hover round just above the heads of the hunters, but out of gunshot range until the men were so exasperated that they lost all their strength and couldn't lift their arms to use the oars or guns. At last darkness arrived and they were compelled to camp in the brush and kill the decoys, which they baked in a log fire."

A confirmation of the story will probably reach town by the underground railroad sometime next year, and in the mean time it will stand as the record of the hunters.
