A Trackless Trolley.

The first trackless trolley street railway has begun operations in Berlin, and is apparently a success. They derive their power from an overhead trolley. They have a speed of over ten miles an hour. They are equipped with a special type of wheels to prevent stoppages by snow.

Tests are being made of a new express locomotive on the railway between Berlin and Hamburg. The engine is much larger than any in service at present. The engineer occupies a wedge shaped cab in front of the engine and two firemen are in the rear. Objection is made to this location of the engineer on the ground that the locomotive would be uncontrollable in case of his disability. The engine has a speed of 100 miles an hour hauling three coaches.
