## FORMER SENATOR SHOUP

#### Died After a Lingering IIIness--- Prominent in **Idaho Politics**

Boise, Idaho, Dec. 21.-Former United States Senator George L. Shoup, died this morning aged 68 years, after a lingering illness. He was the last territorial governor of Idaho, and was first elected when the state was admitted. He was elected to the senate in 1890, and served two terms.

Re-Elected Mayor.

Ashland, Or., Dec. 21 .- In one of the most exciting elections in the history of local municipal politics yesterday. H. S. Evans, the citizens' nominee, was re-elected mayor over E. D. Briggs, who headed the people's ticket, by the narrow margin of 12 votes, in a total of 732 east in the several wards. Milton Berry, people's, was re-elected city recorder over ex-Senator S. H. Holt, the citizens' nominee, by 72. C. H. Thomas, people's, was elected city treasurer over L. L. Munlit by a single vote. Two people's ticket nominees for councilmen, O. O. Helman, in the first ward, and C. E. Eliason, in the second ward, were elected by good majorities over J. K. VanSant and D. D. Applegate, and one citizens' nominee for council, W. N. Grubb, in the third ward was elected over F. W. Moore by 40 votes. A vote was also taken on the question of license or no license for sa oons for the ensuing year, and resulted in 357 for and 366 against. Both tickets were pledged to abide by the vote of the people on the liquor question.

Peter Maher Broke.

Philadelphia, Dec. 21.—Peter Maher, the dethroned pugilistic champion of Ireland, is to have a big benefit at the Gentlemen's Sporting Club tonight. Maher is practically penniless, notwithstanding the fact that he has earned more than \$100,000 since he first became prominent in the prize ring a decade or two ago. His fighting days are now over, and it is the intention of his friends to assist him in going into some other business. Among the fighters who have volunteered to appear at the benefit are Tommy Love, George Cole, Danny Dougherty, Jack Williams and "Philadelphia" Jack
