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COUNCIL PLACES NEW LIGHTS

Sunday Closing Ordinance Goes Over on Objection of Sims.

The city council met last night in adjourned regular session, with 10 aldermen present. Those absent were Catlin, Smith, Young and Walker.

The committee on current expenses reported favorably on the following claims against the city, and warrants were ordered drawn for the several amounts:

The recorder was ordered to draw a warrant for John A. Carson for \$500 for legal services rendered in defending the city in their damage suit.

A petition for establishing a grade on Commercial street in Ward Five was granted.

The petitions of Neusbaum Bros., W. R. Anderson and J. P. Rogers for liquor licenses were referred to the committee on licenses.

The committee on streets reported on the amounts needed for street machinery, including a street broom, and rendered the opinion that sweeping the streets both winter and summer is necessary, no matter what kind of pavement is used. They also reported on the value of the different kinds of paving, and stated that the time has arrived when the streets should be paved. The report was adopted.

The committee on current expenses reported favorably on bills against the streets and warrants were ordered drawn.

The bill for a saloon ordinance was reported on favorably by the committee on ordinances, with the recommendation that the clause about ex-convicts be stricken out of the ordinance and that it be made to read that the license be revoked on the first conviction for violation of the ordinance instead of the second, as it originally read. The report was adopted, and the question was put as to the third reading of the bill, and all aldermen voted in the affirmative but Sims, who stated that he was not present when the bill was read 10 days ago, and he had not had time to investigate it, and therefore he would vote no. One vote of dissent was enough to stop the reaching, this being an adjourned session of the meeting at which the bill was introduced.

The committee on lights reported on the petitions for street lights as follows:

For a light to be placed on the corner of Chemeketa and Liberty streets.
For a light to be placed on the corner of Summer and Marion streets.
For a light to be placed on the corner of Fifteenth and Court streets.
For a light to be placed on the corner of Fourteenth and Marion streets.
For the light which is now located on the corner of Capital and Marion streets to be removed to the corner of Union and Capital streets.
For the light now located on the corner of Division and Liberty streets to be removed to the center of Liberty street, 10 feet south of the south end of the bridge across North Mill creek.

On motion the council adjourned until the next regular meeting, Tuesday, January 3, 1905, when the new city officers and aldermen will be sworn in.
