Governor Mickey Sworn In Again.

Lincoln, Neb., Jan. 5.—The inauguration of Governor Mickey today for a second term was one of the most brilliant events of the kind ever seen here. The inaugural ceremony took place in the presence of both branches of the legislature, state officials and a large gathering of other spectators that included visitors from every part of the state. Governor Mickey's inaugural address dealt at considerable length with the administration of state affairs and particularly with the financial condition of the state. Especial attention was given to the revenue laws and a number of amendments of a corrective nature were recommended for the consideration of the legislature. Preparations on an elaborate scale have been completed for the official reception and inaugural ball to take place this evening at the capitol.

I claim there is only one reason why the upland birds are being exterminated and it is DOGS, DOGS. Take our native pheasants for instance, which are almost extinct now, and any one who understands the nature of these birds, or have ever hunted them, knows it would be impossible to exterminate them without dogs. They do not need any other protection. Do away with the dogs and they can take care of themselves. Take the China pheasants; they have no show whatever from a hunter and a good dog, it makes no difference how far the bird would fly or how good he can hide a hunter can follow him up and run him down, and it is sure death for him any way. There is no use to dodge the real cause any longer, if you want to protect (please emphasize the WANT), the way to do it is to protect. Mr. Editor, I have a dog, and love to hunt with a dog as well as any one, for it is very nice to stand up or sit on a rail fence and watch the dog do all the work. I will hate to give up my dog as badly as any one, but if we want the birds protected we must do away with them or else the same conditions will exist as now. A China pheasant is perfectly able to care for himself and needs no other protection. Then when a man goes out and is his own dog and has killed the limit, I will guarantee he will be tired enough to go home. Cut out the dog and you will cut out half of the hunters at once, or until game has increased so it will be easy to find them. Make it a fine of \$100 or 30 days in jail, half the fine to go to the informer, the balance to costs of case and expenses of keeping the game warden. Then it will be only a few years until we can go out and kill a few birds without the dog, and we won't have to travel all over 40 farms to do it.

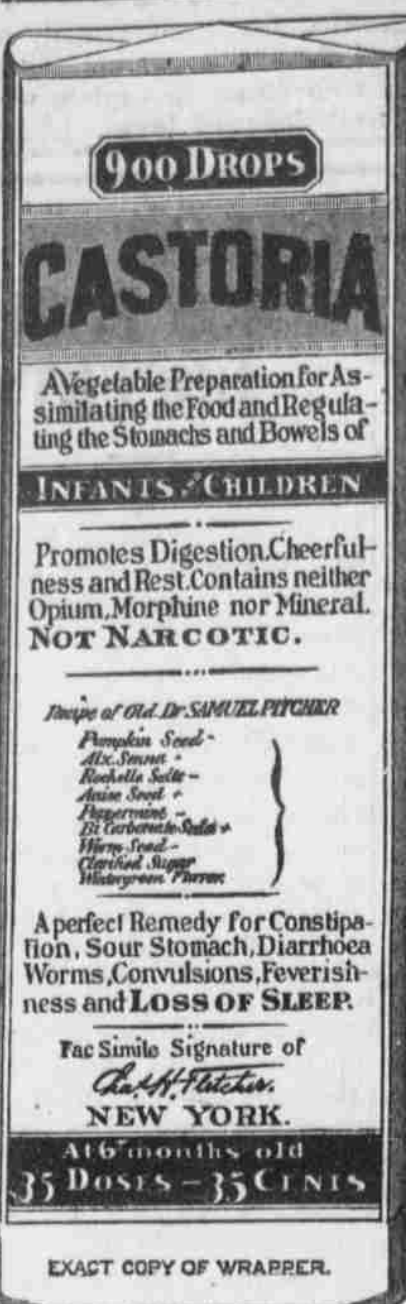
