

SALOON BILL AGAIN SIDETRACKED BY COUNCIL

Office of City Attorney Is Created at \$300 per Annum

The bill for the proposed saloon ordinance was again side-tracked at last night's regular meeting of the city council, on motion of Alderman Cross to have it re-referred to the ordinance committee for further consideration. Alderman Bayne introduced a proposed amendment to the bill, that requires all applicants for saloon licenses who wish to conduct their business in a building which was not previously used for that business, to secure the consent of all property owners on the same side of the street within 100 feet on each side of the building to be occupied. This amendment was also referred to the committee, and will probably be adopted.

The bond and application of Bordune & Ammon for a saloon license was reported upon unfavorably by the committee on ordinances, and the committee's report was approved by unanimous vote of the council. The bond and application of J. A. Cooper was referred to the license committee.

The following were elected pound masters in the three new wards of the city: Fifth ward, J. C. Marsh; sixth ward, E. T. Malvin; seventh ward, J. H. Penland.

The special committee appointed to consider the recommendations made by Mayor Waters in his annual message reported recommending that the various matters touched upon by the mayor be referred to the proper council committees.

A bill for an ordinance was introduced fixing the salaries of certain officers of the city. The officers named in the bill and the amounts fixed for their annual salaries are as follows:

Marshal, \$1200; recorder, \$1200; treasurer, \$800; city attorney, \$300; street commissioner, \$780; chief of fire department, \$780; engineer of fire department, \$780; driver of engine team, \$600; driver of hose wagon, \$600; day policeman and health officer \$720; night policemen, each \$720.

The only new office created is that of city attorney, which, after due consideration was believed by the mayor and aldermen to be a move along the lines of economy since in one case taken into the courts during the last year the city was required to pay \$500 attorney's fees.

city park board.

The report, which is principally financial, shows that there was a balance on hand on June 6th of \$174.30; that they received from the council during the six months \$100; from the "sale of hay" off the Wilson avenue, \$6; donation of Wm. Brown, et al., \$60.75; freight rebate on granite sand through courtesy of W. E. Coman, G. F. & P. A. of the Southern Pacific Railway Company, \$27; sand, J. H. Albert, \$6.80; labor of superintendent, Wm. Manning, donated, \$40; making a total receipts of \$414.85.

The disbursements included cleaning Marion square, \$18; removing a tree, \$4; cement walk at city hall, \$4.50; care of and improvements on Wilson's avenue, \$208.60.

This leaves a balance in the fund for Wilson's avenue on December 31, 1904, of \$34.55 and for Marion square, \$176.30.

The board asks for \$150 for tiling Wilson's avenue and \$200 for filling and leveling that park.

G. Stolz was elected a member of the city board of health commissioners to fill the vacancy caused by the resignation of Prof. J. H. Tutill.

The matter of electing a member of the park board to succeed Mr. C. A. Gray, whose term has expired, was postponed until the next regular meeting of the council.

A bill for an ordinance was also introduced to provide for the construction of a Howatrus single span bridge across South Mill creek on High street. Both bills were referred to the ordinance committee.

Petitions were read asking for the construction of sidewalks in front of lots 1, 3 and 4, block 21, in Capital Park addition; on the north side of Bellevue street between Fourteenth and Seventeenth, and on the west side of Twenty-first street between Asylum Avenue and State street. The petitions were referred to the street committee.

A petition signed by W. L. Staley and others for the laying of a water main on Capital street, near Oak, was referred to the committee on fire and water, as was also a petition for the construction of a corrugated iron store building, 10x16 feet in dimensions, and one story high, adjoining Danon & Pawk's grocery store on Commercial street.

The matter of erecting a street lamp at the intersection of Seventeenth and Kansas streets in the sixth ward, and another in the fifth ward, at some point to be selected, was referred to the committee on lights.

The street committee reported favorably upon the matter of setting the grade stakes for a new sidewalk on South Commercial street and recommended that the survey be made and a sidewalk ordered constructed. The report was adopted.

The committee on fire and water reported the sale of "Dan," the bay horse formerly in the service of the Salem fire department, for the sum of \$60. The council adopted the report.

The ways and means committee was granted further time in which to report upon the examination of ex-City Treasurer Meir's financial report.

LAST HOPE GONE

Governor Bell Refused to Interfere in Behalf of Mrs. Rogers

Rutland, Vt., Jan. 18.—The refusal of Governor Bell to interfere in the case destroys the last hope of Mrs. Mary Rogers to escape the gallows. She will consequently be hanged at Windsor on February 3, and will be the first woman executed in Vermont in nearly three-quarters of a century.

Since the announcement of the Governor's decision, Mrs. Rogers has shown no change in demeanor. Her only companion is Miss Durkee, the matron, who treats her with motherly kindness. The woman's spiritual adviser says that the prisoner acts and talks as in a dream, and that the weight of the doom impending is markedly manifest. The death warrant will not be read to her until the day before the execution.

Some of the leading lawyers of Vermont have declared the opinion that for \$1000 the case could be carried to the United States supreme court and a stay obtained for so long a time at least that the woman would never hang. Windsor people declare the execution a disgrace to the state and moved for the prisoner if the execution were deferred.
