

CONVENTION BILL AS AMENDED

Black Lines at End of Section Two May Be Struck Out

Were Not in Original Brownell Bill--Sen- ator Will Move to Strike Them Out in Joint Convention Wednesday

SENATE BILL NO. 180.

Substitute for Senate Bill No. 2, Intro-
duced by Senator Brownell of
Clackamas County.

A bill for an act to provide for a con-
vention to prepare a new constitution
for the state of Oregon, and to provide
for a special election to elect delegates
thereto, and for the appointment of dele-
gates at large thereto, and for the sub-
mission of the constitution to [be] pre-
pared to the qualified electors of Ore-
gon, and appropriating money to pay
the expenses of said convention.

Be it enacted by the people of the
state of Oregon:

Section 1. An election shall be held
on the 5th day of June, 1905, of dele-
gates to meet in convention in the hall
of representatives at the capitol in the
city of Salem at 12 o'clock noon on
the 8th day of January, 1906, to pre-
pare a new constitution for the state
of Oregon.

Section 2. THE NUMBER OF DELE-
GATES TO SUCH CONVENTION
SHALL BE 90. SIXTY OF SAID DELE-
GATES SHALL BE CHOSEN BY
THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS OF
THIS STATE at the special election
provided for in section 1 of this act,
and said 60 delegates shall be elected
by counties of this state under the fol-
lowing apportionment:

THIRTY OF SUCH DELEGATES
SHALL BE DELEGATES FOR THE
STATE AT LARGE AND SHALL BE
APPOINTED BY THE SUPREME
COURT OF THE STATE OF OREGON
ON OR BEFORE 15 DAYS AFTER
THE DATE OF THE SPECIAL ELEC-
TION PROVIDED FOR IN SECTION
OF THIS ACT. NOT MORE THAN
TWO-THIRDS OF SAID 30 DELE-
GATES SHALL BE APPOINTED
FROM ONE POLITICAL PARTY,
AND SAID 30 DELEGATES AT
LARGE SHALL BE APPOINTED
BETWEEN THE DIFFERENT SEC-
TIONS OF THE STATE.

Section 3. Said 60 delegates to be
elected at said special election shall
be nominated by petition
SIGNED BY AT LEAST 5 PER CENT
OF THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS IN
THE COUNTY where such a delegate
may be elected according to the last
poll. Said petition to be filed in the
office of the county clerk of
the county from which such nomi-
nee is a delegate, and in the
office of a joint delegate, in the office
of the clerk of any one of the coun-
ties from which such nominee is a joint

delegate, on or before the 6th of May,
1905, and the delegates from each
county receiving the highest number of
votes at said special election, shall be
the delegates from such county to said
constitutional convention.

Section 4. The notice of election to
elect delegates to the convention here-
by called, nominations, elections, count-
ing and canvassing of votes, and count-
ing and canvassing votes for and
against the new constitution to be pre-
pared by said convention and all things
necessary thereto, shall be governed by
the general election laws applying to
the election of members of the house
of representatives of Oregon and by
balloting on questions submitting to
the electors, except as in this act is
otherwise especially provided.

Section 5. If at any time after the
election of delegates and before the
final adjournment of the convention a
vacancy shall occur in any delegation
from any county or counties, the gov-
ernor shall fill said vacancy by appoint-
ing a delegate who shall be from the
same county and of the same political
party as was the delegate originally
elected.

Section 6. THE QUALIFICATIONS
OF DELEGATES SHALL BE THE
SAME AS ARE REQUIRED FOR
MEMBERS OF THE HOUSE OF REP-
RESENTATIVES. They shall meet at
the time and place herein designated,
take their oath of office forthwith, and
immediately proceed to organize the
convention and formulate a constitution
for Oregon. They shall choose the
necessary officers from among their
number to preside over the delibera-
tions and may adopt regulations to gov-
ern their proceedings. The convention
shall be the sole judge of the qualifica-
tions and election of its members; it
shall not adjourn for more than three
days at one time until its labors shall
be completed. The constitution so pre-
pared shall be engrossed, and it shall be
the duty of the president, secretary
and members of the convention to sign
the engrossed copy and file it in the
office of the secretary of state.

Section 7. The provisions of the con-
stitution shall be arranged in numbered
articles and sections and the titles shall
indicate as clearly as possible the sub-
ject and nature of the articles and sec-
tions.

Section 8. On or before the 15th
day of April, 1906, the secretary of
state shall mail to the county clerks of
the several counties of this state print-
ed copies of the constitution, filed in his
office by said convention, and immedi-
ately after the receipt thereof by said
county clerks and not later than the 1st
day of May, 1906, said county clerk
shall mail to each qualified elector in
his county, according to the last regis-
tration record, a printed copy of said
constitution.

Section 9. THE CONSTITUTION
FORMULATED BY THE CONVEN-
TION SHALL BE SUBMITTED TO
THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS OF
OREGON FOR ADOPTION OR RE-
JECTION AT THE GENERAL ELEC-
TION TO BE HELD ON THE FOURTH
DAY OF JUNE, 1906, and said consti-
tution shall provide the form of the
questions that may be submitted for
adoption or rejection by said electors.
It shall be the duty of the governor
to publish his proclamation of the re-
sult of the vote for and against the
constitution and any special questions
that may be submitted, in six news-
papers of general circulation in this state,
within 30 days after said election. If
a majority of the votes cast on said
proposed constitution shall be in favor
thereof, it shall be the constitution of
this state from and after the time
fixed by said convention.

Section 10. The delegates attending

the convention shall receive for their
services \$5 per day from the commence-
ment of the session, but such compensa-
tion shall not exceed \$300 for any dele-
gate; they shall also receive the sum
of \$3 for every 20 miles they shall travel
in going to and returning from their
place of meeting on the most usual
route. The president and secretary of
the convention shall receive an addi-
tional compensation equal to their per
diem allowance as members.

Section 11. There is hereby appro-
priated the sum of \$50,000, or so much
thereof as may be necessary, to be paid
out of any money in the state treasury
not otherwise appropriated, for the pay-
ment of the per diem and mileage of
the delegates and the necessary ex-
penses of the convention. The secre-
tary of state shall provide and furnish
to the convention necessary supplies
and furniture, stationery, lights, fuel,
etc., in like manner as he does for the
legislative assembly.

STATE CENSUS GRAFT

Will Multiply Function
of Labor Com-
missioner

Appropriates \$7500, Will
Cost Great Deal for Print-
ing and What for?

The constitution requires a state
census every ten years, and 1905 is
the year it falls upon. This census is
to be taken by county assessors.

The law has never been complied
within the past at any expense to the
state, but is now to be made use of
to build up the office of labor commis-
sioner at an expense of \$7500.

That is the purpose of house bill No.
376, which puts "the commissioner of
the bureau of labor statistics and in-
spectors of factories and workshops" in
charge of the state census of 1905.

The title of that official hereafter
will be elongated and added to by the
words "and superintendent of state
census" and his duties and emolu-
ments correspondingly increased.

The tendency of the census opera-
tors of the government have been to
become perpetual, and the effect of this
bill would be to make the office of la-
bor commissioner an expensive depart-
ment of the state, with about \$10,000
worth of printing, with large volumes
