MARION COUNTY GOOD ROADS MOVEMENT

City of Salem Puts Up Two Thousand Dollar Subscription

That Will Result in From Seven to Ten Thousand Dollars Being Expended on Highways

Salem business men have responded handsomely for the good roads movement inaugurated by County Judge Scott, and the \$2000 purse is practically raised. This work was started by a conference between the county court, the officials of the Greater Salem Commercial Club and a delegation of good roads formers from Rosedale and Liberty, which mapped out the work along the lines of co-operation between the city, the courts and the farmers.

The Marion county court is to add \$800 to this sum, and the \$28,000 will be divided into seven purses, as follows, that will be given to the seven roads leading into this city that subscribe the largest sums for permanent road work. In each case the prize money is to be not more than 40 per cent of the subscription:

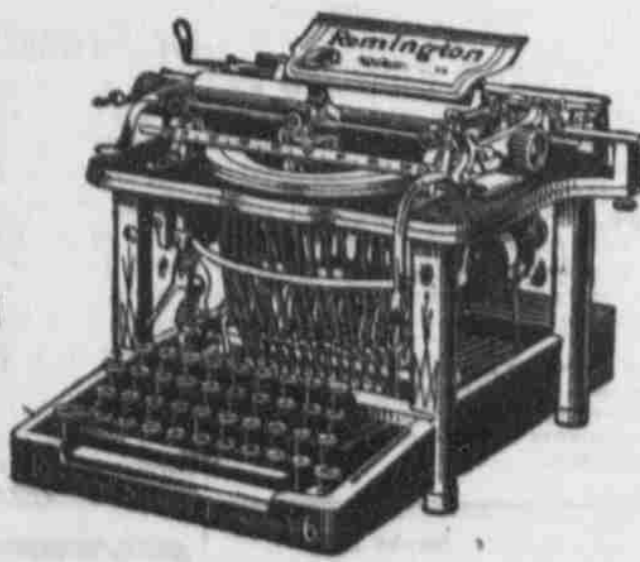
