voice of the country and the cry of its mothers. If the emperor leads the country into the paths of greatness, its women will help in the work of its organization by guiding their brothers and children into the new way and a life of light."

St. Petersburg, March 13.—The czar has summoned a war council for tomorrow to consider the situation in Manchuria, and the general war problem. No further news was received from the front this morning, but the magnitude of the catastrophe is apparent to all. The war office admits that remnants of the army are still in danger. It is reported that the Japanese flanking columns are in touch above Tie Pass, and there may be a surrender there. It is admitted that the Russian killed and wounded already total 65,000.

Paris, March 13.—A telegram from St. Petersburg says that strong agitation has been started on the Bourse and in commercial circles looking toward peace.

St. Petersburg, March 13.—Kurapatkin reports that the retreat of the convoy is being carried on amidst extraordinary difficulties. Two regiments are practically wiped out. The total Russian wounded in the recenting is 50,000. A division and a half of Japanese are within a short distance of the rear guard, which is under constant fire. General Kaibars lost 25,000 prisoners, and barely escaped with the remnant of his division. He is now being pursued. General Meyerdorf, commander of the first corps, is wounded.

### DIED.

DURBIN.—At his home in Huntington, Oregon, Sunday, March 12, 1905, C. J. Durbin, aged 84.

Deceased was an uncle of Frank Durbin, of this city, and was a pioneer of 1845. He leaves two brothers, Solomon Durbin, of San Diego, Cal., and Isaac Durbin, of this city.

### Demand Made on Turkey.

Constantinople, March 13.—The Austrian ambassador has presented to the Porte a note demanding recognition of Austria as protector of the Catholics throughout European Turkey, and the recognition of 300 Austria-Hungarian schools throughout Turkey.

### Mrs. Holman Dead.

One of Salem's noblest women has passed from our midst, and the family are overwhelmed with the great and sudden sorrow that has come to them. Mrs. Minnie S. Holman, wife of Thomas Holman, of this city, died at the Florence Sanatorium yesterday, from the shock of a surgical operation.

Deceased was a daughter of Mr. and Mrs. John Holman, and was born in London, Canada, in 1863. She came to Oregon with her parents in 1866, and has lived the most of her life at Salem. She was married to Mr. Thomas Holman, who still survives her. Had she lived until the 21st of May she would have been 42 years old.

She was a member of the Episcopal church of this city and of the Order of Maccabees. She was well-known in this city, and has a host of friends, who are stricken with grief at her sudden demise. Always cheerful in life, she was the same until death. She is a woman who will not soon be forgotten, for she always had a kindly word for everyone, and was ever ready to lend a helping hand. She was a leader in the social and church circles, and will be greatly missed.

She leaves two sisters, Mrs. H. George Meyer, of this city, and Mrs. J. H. Lunn, of San Francisco, and also a brother, Walter J. Holman, of San Francisco. Both the brother and sister will arrive on the morning train from that place.

The funeral will be held Wednesday, at 2 o'clock, Bishop Moore's, of the Episcopal church, of Portland, will take charge of the services. The many friends extend their sympathy to their family in this hour of their deep affliction.

## BRITISH CABINET CHANGES

London, March 13.—Official announcement is made of the appointment of Walter Hume Long, president of the local government board, to succeed Mr. Wyndham as chief secretary of Ireland.

Gerald Balfour, president of the board of trade, succeeds Mr. Long; the Marquis of Salisbury, lord of the privy seal, becomes president of the board of trade, retaining his former office, and Alwynne Fellowes, junior lord of the treasury, is appointed president

of the board of agriculture, succeeding the Earl of Onslow, who recently was appointed chairman of the committee in the house of lords.

The new cabinet appointments have some points of interest. First and most important for the government they involve no by-elections, and second, Lord Salisbury and Alwynne Fellowes are both confirmed free traders, whose entry into the cabinet is not likely to be acceptable to the Chamberlain party.

### Court Hears Case.

Denver, March 11.—The state supreme court today heard the arguments in the question of taking up the interrogation submitted by the general assembly with a view of testing the legality of the proposition to oust Adams and sent Lieutenant-Governor McDonald.

## RIO GRANDE COLLISION

Colorado Springs, March 13.—Missouri Pacific train No. 11, southbound, on the Rio Grande road, collided with train No. 4, northbound, 14 miles south of here, seriously injuring Pullman Conductor Creighton and Charles Richardson and wife, of Buffalo. Creighton may die. Several others are slightly injured.
