dition at St. Louis, will be even better displayed at Portland.  
 San Bernardino county will make a feature of its cement and other building materials. Los Angeles county will have display of tiles with its exhibit, and Ventura county will make a feature of its sandstone display.  
 A feature of the state display which will be of particular interest will be the petroleum exhibit, which will be comprehensive and elaborate. Included in the petroleum exhibit will be samples from every oil county and district in the state and from every producer. It will be the most complete exhibit of its kind ever assembled for a world's fair. In accordance with the exposition's policy, to make the displays at the Western World's fair illustrative of the processes of manufacture, rather than mere collection of finished materials, the petroleum exhibit will include the crude materials, the finished article, and all the by-products manufactured from it, so as to give a complete and comprehensive idea of the magnitude of the business to people not familiar with the oil-producing industry.  
 Besides the displays already mentioned, there will be exhibits of marble, granite, terra cotta, slate, soda and minerals of all kinds taken from the different sections of the state. The whole will be attractively arranged, and the ore displays will be shown in glass cases. The new ruling, by which states are enabled to house their exhibits in their state buildings, will make it possible for Californians to see what their state has to show in the mineral line, without having to search for it among the hundreds of displays from all over the world in the Palace of Mines and Metallurgy.

**California Will Show Mineral Wealth.**  
 Portland, March 23.—While the state of California, which, with its \$90,000 appropriation, will make one of the finest state displays at the Lewis and Clark exposition, will have a complete exhibit of all its varied resources at the Western World's fair, especial attention will be paid to the securing of a mining display, which is intended to be second to that of no other state.  
 California's mining exhibit, like its other exhibits, will be housed in the California building, a beautiful structure built in the shape of a Maltese cross, each wing of which will be a reproduction of an old Spanish mission. Specimens of gold, copper and other ores will be found there from the different counties where they are pro-

duced. Nevada and Toulumne counties have already secured some fine specimens of gold ores which they will exhibit. Nevada county, which won a gold medal at St. Louis, will, at Portland, add its excellent collection of ores to the state display. The display in its entirety will show the mining industry in every stage.  
 A number of counties will make specialties of products which are peculiar to them, or in which they excel. Among these, San Diego county has already decided to give special attention to its gems, it being the chief producer of these in the state, the number and quality produced being far superior to any other section. Its turquoise, garnets, garnets, tourmaline crystals and other precious stones, which won high recog-
