Taught Monkey to Talk.

of Mexico, April 8.—The director of the national museum of this city received a copy of a report issued by S. W. Speitzhizze, director of the museum in Rio Janeiro, Brazil, describing the results of his experiments with monkeys. The report is sensational.

Speitzhizze declares that he taught one large ape to talk and to follow commands, and says that he is possible to develop similar

powers and intelligence in the majority of monkeys. The talking ape at present simply repeats words and expressions like a parrot, but the Brazilian doctor says he thinks the animal will ultimately reach such a grade of intelligence as to be able to express his desires in speech. Dr. Speitzhizze concludes his report with the statement that he is confident monkeys can be made useful in many kinds of work, and that they can be trained for offensive and defensive action in case of war.

THE "SOAK HENEY" POLICY

District Attorney McNary Will "Heneyize" Oregon. Some Comment on the Possibilities Involved

The bomb-smelling policy of "soak Heney" is still the rule in some quarters.

To get an idea of political consistency you have but to change the name of Heney to "Roosevelt's representative." The much admired and loved-by-the-people President went clear to California and selected Heney to conduct these cases. The President's judgment is seriously questioned in these "Down with Heney" howls, and his honesty of purpose is assailed, for he should not hesitate to remove Heney at once—according to the cry raised against the defenders of the government. But the President evidently knows his business, for he does not remove Prosecutor Heney.

Instead of roasting Heney, who is only following out the instructions of Roosevelt, why not be consistent and soak the President. He is responsible for all that has taken place in Portland in these land cases, and will be responsible for what is forthcoming. With evidence that will certainly make good the cases of the government—and this evidence well known to the "Down with Heney" faction—yet every effort is being made to clog the wheels of justice. It is not clear, however, just how those who are set against the government winning, expect to accomplish anything by inconsistent and silly attacks upon a man (Heney) employed to represent it. The idea is anarchistic to the last degree. The plan of attack is worthy only of anarchy. President McKinley was assassinated by reason of the same idea. The murderer thought to crush the government by killing its president. So, it is evidently expected by some, that to defame Heney, the overwhelming evidence in possession of the government will come to naught. If this is not anarchy, pure and simple, neither was the assassination of McKinley an anarchy.

If these advocates of "law and order," have any foundation to stand on, why not extol the innocence of the defendants instead of avoiding the issue. The only question before us is, whether these defendants are guilty or innocent. If innocent why not spend more time showing how improbable it would be for any wrong against the government to have been committed? Instead of making good its own side, the belated persecutors of Roosevelt's man discharge their powderless weapons at the prosecutor. This may prove fortunate, for while the missiles are centering at Heney's head the rest of the legal machinery of the government may escape its "awful" fire. These same "Heney fighters" were with the government when the little fish were getting their tails singed, but when the whales, which can swallow a great deal more than the minnow, get tangled up, then the tune was promptly changed. The result of entangling a few "whales" has not already been without effect, since generosity has been overflowing the well of genuine charity ever since.

Roosevelt is the man to assail in these land fraud cases. He is the backbone of Heney and is showing Oregonians what he does when he gets a hold of a California lion. Just now he is hunting lions in Colorado and will attack his Oregon meal with a sharp appetite when he returns. The "soak Heney" policy is dangerous. It will have a tendency to induce fear into prosecutors in general and will prevent and smother investigations otherwise carried out. The result of the "soaking" process will be to make an example of Heney and will be a warning to all others not to dare follow his line of prosecution.

District Attorney John H. McNary has opened the investigation for the state of Oregon. Just at present the matter is progressing nicely without any opposition from either the papers or the public in general. Looking at the experience of Prosecutor Heney, the question naturally arises, how long will it be before the "wolves" begin to take the trail? In answer to this question it can be said that just as soon as the indictments begin to be felt, then the cry will be "Down with McNary." And that this will in all probability be the case has evidence in the fact that some of the big game has already taken to the woods. John H. McNary and Francis J. Heney are wading through an opportunity to immortalize themselves in the history of Oregon and the United States. Prosecutor Heney will enjoy the satisfaction of being the first government official to "get returns" from the federal grand jury room, and John H. McNary will have the credit due from all "square deal" men, in being the first prosecutor to voluntarily take up the fight where it must necessarily be left off by Heney. As Heney has already

proved he has not jumped into this matter of convicting land sharks without first getting enough evidence to win out, and it is hinted that our own prosecutor has loaded his gun before he proceeded to fire. While the frauds practiced in Oregon are not to be compared with those which beset Wyoming, Colorado and other states, yet they are in themselves extensive enough to clean up the business of robbing our state, and will fit the daring prosecutor for higher honors from the people. White-washing has had its day. After while the fence, so often coated with the whitewash paint, will become rotten from the acid in the paint and fall to pieces, leaving the upright posts to mark the history and show where the panels once were.

But for these purifying spasms, occurring as they do at intervals, the whole fabric of government would fall apart and end in the downfall of social organization. There is one thing sure, and that is, if Mr. Heney and Mr. McNary learn a lesson from "monkeying" with the "band wagon" there will also be a "few" of the defendants promised who will know more than they did before they were "investigated."

It is hard to expect that justice will be meted out entirely as deserved owing to the enormous extensions of the investigations, making it impossible to reach into every case, but if we can secure, as a people, a check upon the impunity with which we are robbed of our public domains, and the conviction of the principals, it will be enough, and at the same time it will be more than the people are in the habit of either expecting or getting.
