Northern Minnesota Teachers.

St. Cloud, Minn., April 14.—The Northern Minnesota Teachers' association began its annual convention at the state normal school here today with a large attendance. The morning was devoted to a visit of inspection to the normal and city schools. The regular business sessions began this afternoon with Superintendent C. F. W. Carlson of Alexandria presiding. The program arranged for the various sessions, which will continue over tomorrow, is one of general interest, including the reading and discussion of papers on topics relating to every department of educational work. In addition there will be lectures and addresses by a number of educators of wide prominence.

National League Season Opens.

New York, April 14.—The familiar cry of the umpire to "Play ball!" was heard at the Polo grounds this afternoon for the first time this season. It was the opening of the National League season and a gala time it was for the thousands of fans of Greater New York. The hoisting of the National League pennant was greeted with maddening cheers, for it was the first time the coveted "rag" had been seen in New York in 15 years. There was music galore and a spirit of enthusiasm prevailed among the players as well as the spectators. At 4 o'clock the champion Giants and the Boston team appeared. The players of both teams, arrayed in new uniforms, executed the usual awkward squad march from the clubhouse to the diamond. The old favorites and new comers were warmly greeted, while a few good-natured roasts

were, of course, handed out to the visitors from the Massachusetts town.

Over in Brooklyn it was also opening day for the baseball enthusiasts. There the home team faced the Philadelphia club for the initial game of the season. The other opening dates of the National League today are Chicago at St. Louis and Pittsburgh at Cincinnati.

Texas T. P. A.

Dallas, Texas, April 14.—The freedom of the city has been turned over to the traveling men for today and tomorrow, who are holding the state convention of the Travelers' Protective Association. The city is attired in national colors in honor of the occasion. The early morning was devoted to receiving delegates and their wives and seeing that they were assigned to comfortable quarters. Later in the day the first regular session of the convention was held, being given over to the welcomes and responses and the work of organization. President George Diehl, of Fort Worth, presided and presented his annual address, which was followed by the reports of other officers and of the standing committees. These reports showed that the state division is now in better shape than ever before. A gratifying increase was made in the membership during the last twelve months, while the cash balance in the treasury is larger than ever before in the history of the Texas branch of the order. A business session will be held tomorrow for the election of officers, the choice of delegates to the national convention at Savannah in June and the selection of the place for holding next year's state convention. Houston has sent a large delegation which is whooping it up in favor of that city for next year's gathering.
