Iowa Newspaper Interviews Col. Hofer

ver Cleveland was the sponsor. The public men indicted in Oregon may have been technically guilty or negligent, but that any senator or congressman in Oregon has been a party to corruption directly or indirectly no one seriously believes and they will all be acquitted. There will be convictions, however, of those who have openly and flagrantly conspired to deprive the government of public lands and stricter rules will be enforced in future as a result of the investigations ordered by President Roosevelt.

Drawback of State.

"The reason why Oregon has not settled up faster in the past is that the railroads in Oregon were formerly nearly all leased lines, with nonresident managers. Within a few years they have been acquired by the Harriman syndicate which has built the Lucien cut off across Salt Lake at a cost of \$5,000,000 and will now expend \$3,000,000 in developing its property in Oregon. The Willamette valley will be gridironed with trolley lines in the next ten years and will become one vast fruit garden. The equal of its lands in productivity cannot be found in the world. It is nearly 200 miles north and south and from ten to sixty miles wide, lying sheltered between two chains of mountains ranging north and south. Lands are still cheap and water and timber is plenty.

"The summer climate is said to be the most perfect in the world. In winter it rains about as much in inches as it does in Iowa, but comes down with the gentleness of the dews of mercy described by Portia, in 'The Merchant of Venice.' Do people grow old? I am a younger man today than when I went to Oregon in 1890, and my wife has grown constantly handsomer. The complexion of our women are sought after as models for face powder advertisements. Ours is a land flowing with milk and honey and gold pieces, but that is not saying that the tenderfoot from the East will not be picked up, taken in and done for if he gives anyone the chance. Evansville, Ind., April 15. Democratic congressional convention of the First district, to name a candidate to succeed Congressman Hemenway, was called to order here this noon. Several names are mentioned in connection with the nomination. The special election will be held May 15.

Tonopah Deaths Decrease.

Tonopah, April 17.—Only one death has occurred since yesterday morning, and was due to unsanitary conditions. Specimens of blood in various stages have been sent to the Marine Hospital service at San Francisco, with the view of determining the nature of the maldy. The town is in charge of six committees, each having a district. They are ordering everybody to remove the filth from their yards. Many closets have been nailed up, and others have been upset. The committees have worked all today and far into the night. As in all new mining camps there is much to do.

It is admitted that the death rate in

March and April has been high, but the published reports have been greatly exaggerated. The situation is now well in hand. There is no danger for persons who observe the ordinary sanitary rules. The fears of the residents have been allayed, and there is no further exodus.

Dr. Lee, who was sent from Reno by Governor Sparks to investigate conditions, says that there is no cause to declare a quarantine, and that it was not thought of.
