**WILLIAM WOODLEY DEATH**

The William Woodley death continues to attract attention, and every day brings forth new developments. Woodley, or Wordley, as some appear to think that his name was, died in the Salem Hospital almost two weeks ago, and was buried by the generosity of his friends.

That he had money was known to a number of his acquaintances, but when he was found in his room on Ferry and High streets every evidence had been removed from the room, hardly a piece of soiled clothing being left.

Woodley had an account at a local bank, and had other accounts due him for the sale of liquor taken through legal proceedings, but when he was found in his room he did not have a cent on his person, although it is a well-known fact that shortly before he went to bed he had at least one \$10 gold piece with him, and that he did not spend it is almost certain.

Woodley was a man who did not spend his money, and he made good wages, despite the fact that he was almost 69 years of age. He was strong and able to do all kinds of rough work. Very few men in Salem ever saw "Bill," as he was known, take a drink and he was never known to become intoxicated, although he was constantly around the fiery demon.

There are people who honestly believe that Woodley was killed by means of some kind of dope, and that certain residents of the "Peppermint Flat" section are responsible for the crime. It is said by a party who is in a position to know, that a certain woman, a resident of that place at that time, suffered an injury on the same night that Woodley was found unconscious and that she can tell how, when and where he received the knock-out drops that sent him to his grave.
