WILLAMETTE VALLEY COUNTIES

Will Be Strongly Represented at the State Development League

River Improvement Will Be Demanded for One Thing--Strong Hayseed Representation From Western Oregon

The Willamette Valley counties will be heard from in no uncertain manner at the Portland Development League Convention.

There will be large and enthusiastic delegations from all the principal cities in the valley and they will tackle live subjects.

The standing committee on transportation, composed of L. H. Bingham, of Lane county, B. F. Jones, of Lincoln county, J. C. Cooper, of Yamhill county, Fred Veal, of Linn county, and J. G. Gaham, of Marion county, will make a report on the actual conditions and improvements demanded.

Polk county will be down with a full carload of delegates and with badges a yard long. They will take a band down and ask the rest of the league to help pay the expense.

The Willamette valley has been dominated the "Agricultural Section" and given a half-day at the Marquam Grand Wednesday afternoon to have a program of their own.

Nineteen hundred and five is Oregon's year. The Oregon Development League composed of organized commercial and industrial bodies, will hold its Second Annual Convention in Portland at the Marquam theatre, Wednesday and Thursday, April 26 and 27.

Convention called to order at 9:30, A. M., Wednesday April 26.—Delegates to arrive at nine if possible to register and receive badges. A local reception committee will be on hand to welcome delegates.

In the afternoon the convention will meet in sections devoted to the various industries of the state, enabling delegates to discuss subjects in which they are particularly interested.

The Willamette Valley Agricultural section will occupy the Marquam Grand.

The officers of the Willamette Valley Development League have been asked to arrange a program for the afternoon session of the "Agricultural Section" at the Marquam Grand theatre. The Willamette Valley League program will be announced on Wednesday morning. The officers will have headquarters at the New Lange hotel, Washington and Sixth streets.

At these sectional conventions a condensed but comprehensive report will be made for representation at the general session Thursday morning.

members of the league feel that this matter is one of vital importance to the commercial interests of this section of the state. One of the largest and richest sections of the state is tributary to the Willamette between Salem and Corvallis. The City of Dallas, Airline and a considerable portion of Polk county is directly tributary to the Willamette by means of the motor line to Independence. The Corvallis & Eastern brings into close touch with Corvallis all the territory westward to the ocean. This large and populous territory and the inland Empire of Linn county depend entirely upon Willamette river transportation for competition in freight rates.

The engineering features involved and the costs of the improvements necessary to afford the relief desired are matters which are more within your knowledge than ours. While we do not desire in any way to belittle the importance of the Yamhill river, yet we feel that the extent of territory affected and the population and business interests to be benefited will suggest to you the propriety of expending a relatively large portion of this appropriation on the Willamette between Corvallis and Salem.
