OLDEST WOMAN IN COUNTY

Mrs. Nancy Harpole is supposed to be the oldest lady now living in Marion county.

Among the few remaining grand old pioneers who fearlessly braved the dangers of the West, and helped to develop this rich and beautiful country, and whose history is indelibly interwoven therewith, there now remains in Marion county an aged woman, Mrs. Nancy Harpole.

This remarkable woman was born in Kentucky February 17, 1808. While a child her parents, Mr. and Mrs. McMullen, moved to Tennessee, thence to Missouri, and later to Illinois, where in 1829 she married Wm. P. Harpole, a man of sterling worth and unimpeachable honesty. In 1851 Wm. P. Harpole and family crossed the plains to Oregon in company with his brother, James W. Harpole, who had previously come to Oregon, and returned to Illinois to secure a band of cattle to bring to Oregon.

Wm. P. Harpole settled in "French Prairie" on a fine donation farm about nine miles north of Salem, where his aged widow now resides, her declining years comforted and brightened by the tender care of her son, LaFayette, her children and her grandchildren.

Wm. P. Harpole was a man of prominence in public affairs and did much to aid in reclaiming this country during its early history, and in the establishment of law among the early pioneers of the original territory of Oregon. He was an influential member of the territorial legislature of Oregon during 1835 and 1836, and died suddenly May, 1862, during his campaign in Marion county for re-election to the legislature, a man loved and respected by all who knew him.

Mrs. Nancy Harpole, now in her 98th year, and the mother of four sons and two daughters, is a remarkable old lady, retaining all her mental faculties, taking a keen interest in current events and the progress of Oregon, recognizing old time friends and neighbors with pleasure and full of interesting recollections of pioneer days and people.

Oysters at Yaquina.

A carload of eastern oysters is at Yaquina bay where they will be planted for propagation. The carload consists of 170 barrels with 10,000 to 15,000 oysters in a barrel. They were ordered by Dr. M. M. Davis of Corvallis. Eastern oysters were tried in Yaquina bay some years ago, but the experiment was not altogether successful. Dr. Davis recently discovered a spat of oysters from the experiment at Yaquina bay and this encourages him to try it again. If the propagation of eastern oysters can be successfully carried on, it will become an important industry on Yaquina bay.

Mediterranean Trade.

In 1904 the number of passengers landed in Naples from German and Austrian ships was 43,145. Of this number 28,449 were carried by the North German Lloyd, 10,561 by the Hamburg-American and 4,135 by the Austrian Lloyd lines. In comparison with these figures the number of passengers landed at the same port from Italian vessels was 35,178, from English vessels 23,159 and from vessels of divers nations 5464.
