WHEN THERE WAS NO TOMORROW

Last Days of the St. Paul Globe Had a Tinge of Sadness

H. W. Crimmer, for many years connected with the now defunct St. Paul Globe, was at the Butler a few evenings ago, stopping in Seattle over night on his way to Honolulu, says the Seattle Star.

Grimmer has occupied various positions on the paper, which voluntarily suspended publication on April 30th, and as he is a good raconteur, the story he told of the "last day on the Globe" had a tinge of sadness and pathos that cannot be produced in cold print.

"It was a cold day when there was 'no tomorrow,'" said Grimmer. "The managing editor and the copy boy were alike in the same boat. The bond of fellowship drew us all closer together on the last day."

"The cub sat down with a sigh and struck the keys with leaden fingers. The woman's club reporter brushed aside a tear with a guilty glance to see if any one observed her weakness. The managing editor's editorial column smacked of sentiment, and the office boy swung his feet disconsolately and murmured, 'Gee, ain't it rotten!'"

"The funny man stuck up a sign, 'No funny jokes wanted today,' and the city editor cynically remarked, 'Don't worry about time copy, boys.'"

"Most characteristic of the day, however, was the cartoon made by the hunchback artist—a mammoth '30,' with the word 'April' above in an inconspicuous place. Beneath ran the quotation from the Persian of Omar, 'The moving finger writes and, having written, moves on.'"

"There was a sense of 'no tomorrow' in the very air. The editorial was a piece of superb humor and pathos. 'Tomorrow the sun will rise,' ran the editorial. 'In the busy highways and in the lonely suburbs the laborer will go to his toil, the Italian will go to work on the railroad, the hod-carrier to his hod, but for us of the Globe there will be no tomorrow.'"

"Not one but would have previously fought with any part of the Globe on the very dropping of a hat. One may quarrel with a friend, but to see the old paper dying a natural death cut them all to the very heart and opened the floodgates of pent-up loyalty and devotion."

"In the composing room the printers, from the foreman to the devil, all waited to see the last run. The pressman, ten years in the Globe's employ, watched the last copy fall from the press, picked it up and put it in his inside pocket, as a mother might take a dead child to her bosom, left the crowd without a word and walked away from the newspaper that was the paper that died before his very eyes."
