GLENDALE'S NEW BANK

The Glendale State Bank is the title of a corporation whose articles were filed with the secretary of state Wednesday. It has a capital stock of \$25,-000, and will, as the name indicates, carry on their business in the pretty little city of Glendale, on the line of the Southern Pacific railroad, in Douglas county, and on the shores of that classic stream known to Southern Oregon people as "Cow" creek. The Glendale News, anticipating the organizing of the bank, says:

"Glendale will soon have a bank, m much-needed institution for this busy place. Col. L. K. Page, president of the Salom State Bank, and A. F. Hofer, business manager of the Dally Capital Journal, of Salem, were in our city m couple of days of the present week to ascertain what encouragement would be given such an undertaking. They soon found there was a general desire that a bank be established here, and several of our leading men, such as R. A. Jones, E. E. Redfield, H. G. Sonnemann and W . H. Redfield will help the move financially by subscribing to some of its stock. Articles of incorporations were drawn and signed on Monday, and there is little doubt but that the proposed bank will be realized in a very short time. The bank will be capitalized for \$25,000, and will be named Goldendale State Bank. It is likely that a brick building will soon be erected, where the banking business will becarried on. J. P. Rogers, of Salem, the third party actively interested with A. F. Hofer and Col. Page in the establishment of this new bank."
